(1) The committee designated by joint rule of the Legislature or by agreement between the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives as the Committee on Public Counsel Oversight shall appoint a Public Counsel to represent the general public of Florida before the Florida Public Service Commission. The Public Counsel shall be an attorney admitted to practice before the Florida Supreme Court and shall be appointed by serve at the pleasure of the Committee on Public Counsel Oversight for a term not to exceed 4 years, except that the Public Counsel shall continue in office beyond

The Public Counsel shall perform his or her 33 34 duties independently. Vacancies in the office shall be filled 35 for the remainder of the unexpired term in the same manner as 36 the original appointment.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2019.
