A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Exceptional Student Education State Assessment Accommodation Task Force; establishing the Exceptional Student Education State Assessment Accommodation Task Force within the Department of Education for the purpose of making recommendations on school accommodations for exceptional students; requiring the task force to convene by a specified date; providing for membership of the task force; requiring that members be appointed by a specified date; providing conditions of meetings of the task force; requiring the task force to post certain documents and recordings to the department's website; providing duties of the task force and the department; requiring the task force to submit recommendations to the State Board of Education by a specified date; requiring the board to submit a report to the Governor and the Legislature by a specified date; providing for the expiration of the task force; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. (1) The Exceptional Student Education State

Assessment Accommodation Task Force, a task force as defined in

s. 20.03, Florida Statutes, is established within the Department of Education and, except as otherwise provided, is subject to s. 20.052, Florida Statutes. The task force shall convene no later than July 1, 2019. The task force shall be composed of 16 members. Five members shall be appointed by the Governor, five members shall be appointed by the President of the Senate, five members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and one member shall be the Commissioner of Education.

- (a) The Governor shall appoint five members to include one school district curriculum director, a current school district assessment director, a public school principal, a current teacher of exceptional education students, and a parent of a public school student with special needs.
- (b) The President of the Senate shall appoint five members to include one current district school superintendent, a current district assessment director, a public school principal, a current teacher of exceptional education students, and a parent of a public school student with special needs.
- (c) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint five members to include at least one school board member, a current teacher of exceptional education students, and a parent of a public school student with special needs.
- (d) Each member shall serve at the pleasure of the officer who appointed the member. Appointments must be made within 30

days after the effective date of this act. A vacancy on the task force shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment.

- (2) The task force shall be chaired by the Commissioner of Education.
- (3) The task force shall meet as necessary, but at least six times, at the call of the chair and at the time and place he or she designates. The task force must conduct its meetings around the state, including rural and urban locations.
- (4) Public documents and recordings of meetings must be posted on the department's website, on an individual page for the task force.
- (5) The task force shall develop and provide recommendations to the State Board of Education for the improvement of accommodations for standardized assessments of exceptional students. The department shall provide staff to assist the task force in performing its duties. In developing its recommendations, the task force shall review:
- (a) The current approved list of accommodations provided to exceptional students;
- (b) Accommodations provided by other states to their exceptional students; and
 - (c) Testimony by stakeholders, including:
- 1. The chief of the Bureau of Exceptional Education and Student Services of the Department of Education;

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2. The Deputy Commissioner of the Division of

Accountability, Research, and Measurement in the Department of

Education;

- 3. Teachers of exceptional education students;
- 4. Parents of exceptional education students;
- 5. Principals and other administrators; and
- 6. District school superintendents.

- (6) The task force shall submit recommendations to the State Board of Education for approval no later than October 1, 2019. The State Board of Education must submit, in writing, its recommendations based on the recommendations of the task force no later than November 1, 2019, to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The task force may submit all or part of its recommendations at any time before October 1, 2019, but a final report summarizing its recommendations must be submitted at the completion of its work. Upon submission of the final report, the task force shall expire.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

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
