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Representative Polsky offered the following:

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## Amendment (with directory and title amendments)

Remove lines 837-1090 and insert:

- (17) THE FLORIDA BEST AND BRIGHTEST TEACHER AND PRINCIPAL ALLOCATION.—
- (a) The Florida Best and Brightest Teacher and Principal Allocation is created to recruit and retain classroom teachers and other instructional personnel who meet the criteria established in s. 1012.731 and reward principals who meet the criteria established in s. 1012.732. Subject to annual appropriation, each school district shall receive an allocation

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based on the district's proportionate share of FEFP base funding.

- (b) From the allocation, each district shall provide the following for eligible classroom teachers and instructional personnel:
- 1. A recruitment salary increase for classroom teachers who fill a designated critical teacher shortage area as defined by the school district or the State Board of Education under s. 1012.07 and other instructional personnel who fill a designated critical shortage area as defined by the school district; and
- 2. A retention salary increase for classroom teachers and other instructional personnel, as provided in s. 1012.731(3)(b).
- (c) From the allocation, each district shall provide eligible principals a salary increase as provided in s. 1012.732(3).

FUNDING COMPRESSION ALLOCATION.—The Legislature may provide an annual funding compression—allocation—in—the—General Appropriations Act. The allocation is created to provide additional funding to school districts and developmental research schools whose total funds per FTE in the prior year were less than the statewide average. Using the most recent prior year FEFP calculation for each eligible school district, the total funds per FTE shall be subtracted from the state average funds per FTE, not including any adjustments made

pursuant to paragraph (18) (b). The resulting funds per FTE

 Appropriations Act, shall then be multiplied by the school district's total unweighted FTE to provide the allocation. If the calculated funds are greater than the amount included in the General Appropriations Act, they must be prorated to the appropriation amount based on each participating school district's share. This subsection expires July 1, 2019.

- (18) TOTAL ALLOCATION OF STATE FUNDS TO EACH DISTRICT FOR CURRENT OPERATION.—The total annual state allocation to each district for current operation for the FEFP shall be distributed periodically in the manner prescribed in the General Appropriations Act.
- (b) The amount thus obtained shall be the net annual allocation to each school district. However, if it is determined that any school district received an under allocation or over allocation for any prior year because of an arithmetical error, assessment roll change required by final judicial decision, full-time equivalent student membership error, or any allocation error revealed in an audit report, the allocation to that district shall be appropriately adjusted. An under allocation in a prior year caused by a school district's error may not be the basis for a positive allocation adjustment for the current year. Beginning with the 2011-2012 fiscal year, If a special program cost factor is less than the basic program cost factor, an audit adjustment may not result in the reclassification of the special

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program FTE to the basic program FTE. If the Department of Education audit adjustment recommendation is based upon controverted findings of fact, the Commissioner of Education is authorized to establish the amount of the adjustment based on the best interests of the state.

Section 10. Subsection (1) of section 1011.71, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1011.71 District school tax.—

If the district school tax is not provided in the General Appropriations Act or the substantive bill implementing the General Appropriations Act, each district school board desiring to participate in the state allocation of funds for current operation as prescribed by s. 1011.62(17) s. 1011.62(18)shall levy on the taxable value for school purposes of the district, exclusive of millage voted under s. 9(b) or s. 12, Art. VII of the State Constitution, a millage rate not to exceed the amount certified by the commissioner as the minimum millage rate necessary to provide the district required local effort for the current year, pursuant to s. 1011.62(4)(a)1. In addition to the required local effort millage levy, each district school board may levy a nonvoted current operating discretionary millage. The Legislature shall prescribe annually in the appropriations act the maximum amount of millage a district may levy.

(4) Each school district shall notify all school personnel who have received training pursuant to this section of mental health services that are available in the school district, and the individual to contact if a student needs services. The term "mental health services" includes, but is not limited to, community mental health services, health care providers, and services provided under ss. 1006.04 and 1011.62(16) 1011.62(17).
