Subsection (1) of section 366.11, Florida 24 Statutes, is amended to read: 25 366.11 Certain exemptions.-

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No provision of this chapter shall apply in any (1)manner, other than as specified in ss. 366.04, 366.05(7) and (8), 366.051, 366.055, 366.093, 366.095, 366.14, 366.15, 366.80-366.83, and 366.91, to utilities owned and operated by municipalities, whether within or without any municipality, or by cooperatives organized and existing under the Rural Electric Cooperative Law of the state, or to the sale of electricity, manufactured gas, or natural gas at wholesale by any public utility to, and the purchase by, any municipality or cooperative under and pursuant to any contracts now in effect or which may be entered into in the future, when such municipality or cooperative is engaged in the sale and distribution of electricity or manufactured or natural gas, or to the rates provided for in such contracts. Section 2. Section 366.15, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 366.15 Medically essential electric public utility service.-As used in this section, the term: (1) "Health care practitioner" means a physician or (a) physician assistant licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459 or an advanced registered nurse practitioner licensed under chapter

48 464.

49 (b) "Medically essential" means the medical dependence on 50 electric-powered equipment that must be operated continuously or

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51 as circumstances require as specified by a <u>health care</u> 52 <u>practitioner</u> physician to avoid the loss of life or immediate 53 hospitalization of the customer or another permanent resident at 54 the residential service address.

55 (2) Each <u>electric</u> public utility shall designate employees
56 who are authorized to direct an ordered continuation or
57 restoration of medically essential electric service. <u>An electric</u>
58 A public utility shall not impose upon any customer any
59 additional deposit to continue or restore medically essential
60 electric service.

(3) (a) Each electric public utility shall post on its 61 62 website a written explanation of the certification process for obtaining medically essential electric service. The website must 63 64 include the standard certification form adopted by the utility 65 pursuant to paragraph (b). Each electric utility shall annually 66 provide a written explanation of the certification process for medically essential electric service to each residential utility 67 68 customer:

69 <u>1. When the customer opens an account for electric service</u>
70 with the electric utility; and

71 <u>2. At least semiannually, either by means of a written</u> 72 <u>bill insert or, if the customer has provided contact information</u> 73 <u>to receive electronic communications from the electric utility,</u> 74 by electronic means.

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(b) Each electric utility shall adopt a standard

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76	certification form to be completed and signed by each
77	residential customer who wishes to have his or her service
78	certified as medically essential. The certification form must
79	include the customer's service address, the customer's name and
80	the account number for the service address, the name of the
81	permanent resident at the service address who is medically
82	dependent on electric-powered equipment and the name of that
83	person's certifying health care practitioner, and the customer's
84	contact information for purposes of receiving communications
85	from the utility by telephone and, if the customer has provided
86	authorization to receive electronic communications by electronic
87	means. The certification form shall include a separate section
88	to be completed and signed by a health care practitioner to
89	certify that electric service is medically essential for the
90	customer or other permanent resident at the service address.
91	This section of the certification form must include the name,
92	business address, and medical license number of the certifying
93	health care practitioner; a statement by the certifying health
94	care practitioner, in medical and nonmedical terms, that
95	specifies why the electric service is medically essential, as
96	defined in subsection (1); and a specification of the time
97	period for which the electric service is expected to remain
98	medically essential.
99	(c) Certification that of a customer's electricity needs
100	<u>are</u> as medically essential requires the customer to complete

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101 forms supplied by the public utility and to submit to the 102 utility a completed standard certification form which includes 103 the health care practitioner's certification a form completed by 104 a physician licensed in this state pursuant to chapter 458 or 105 chapter 459 which states in medical and nonmedical terms why the 106 electric service is medically essential. The certification may 107 not extend beyond 60 months. Falsification of the False 108 certification of medically essential service by a physician is a 109 violation of s. 458.331(1)(h), or s. 459.015(1)(i), or s. 110 464.018(1)(f).

(d) (b) Medically essential service must shall be 111 112 recertified at the expiration of the time period specified in 113 the certification or once every 12 months after certification, 114 whichever is later. The electric public utility shall send the 115 certified customer by regular mail, or by e-mail if the customer has provided the utility with his or her e-mail address, a 116 117 package of recertification materials, including recertification 118 forms, at least 60 30 days before prior to the expiration of the 119 customer's certification. The materials shall advise the 120 certified customer that he or she must complete and submit the 121 recertification forms within 30 days after the expiration of the 122 customer's existing certification. If the recertification forms are not received within this 30-day period, the electric public 123 utility may terminate the customer's certification. No more than 124 once every 12 months during the term of the certification, the 125

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126	electric utility may request verification from the customer that
127	the person for whom electric service is certified continues to
128	reside at the service address.
129	(4) Each <u>electric</u> public utility <u>must</u> shall certify a
130	customer's electric service as medically essential if the
131	customer completes the requirements of subsection (3).
132	(5) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section,
133	an electric a public utility may disconnect service to a
134	residence whenever an emergency may threaten the health or
135	safety of a person, the surrounding area, or the <u>electric</u> public
136	utility's distribution system. The <u>electric</u> public utility shall
137	act promptly to restore service as soon as feasible.
138	(6) <u>A customer whose electric service is certified as</u>
139	medically essential under this section is entitled, at a
140	minimum, to the same time period for payment of bills that
141	applies to all other residential customers served by the
142	electric utility. However, the time period may not be fewer than
143	20 days after the date the bill is mailed or delivered by the
144	utility. If payment or a satisfactory payment arrangement has
145	not been made within the specified time period, the electric
146	utility may schedule disconnection of service for nonpayment of
147	the bill. In addition to any other notice provided in the
148	utility's normal course of business, before the electric utility
149	disconnects service, it shall provide the following notice to
150	each customer whose electric service is certified as medically
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essential under this section:

152 No later than 15 days, and again no later than 7 days, (a) 153 before a scheduled disconnection 24 hours before any scheduled 154 disconnection of service for nonpayment of bills to a customer who requires medically essential service, the electric a public 155 156 utility shall attempt to contact the customer by telephone in 157 order to provide notice of the scheduled disconnection and shall 158 provide the notice in writing, including by electronic means if 159 the customer has provided contact information to receive 160 electronic communications from the electric utility.

If the customer does not have a telephone number 161 (b) 162 listed on the account or if the electric public utility cannot 163 reach the customer or other adult resident of the premises by 164 telephone by the specified time, the electric public utility 165 shall send a representative to the customer's residence to 166 attempt to contact the customer $_{\tau}$ no later than 2 business days 4 167 p.m. of the day before the scheduled disconnection. If contact 168 is not made, however, the electric public utility must may leave 169 written notification at the residence advising the customer of 170 the scheduled disconnection and shall provide such notice by 171 electronic means if the customer has provided contact 172 information to receive electronic communications from the 173 electric utility. 174 175 Thereafter, the electric public utility may disconnect service

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176 on the <u>scheduled disconnection</u> specified date <u>if payment to the</u> 177 <u>electric utility or a satisfactory payment arrangement with the</u> 178 electric utility has not been made.

(7) Each <u>electric</u> <u>public</u> utility customer who requires
medically essential service is responsible for making
satisfactory arrangements with the <u>electric</u> <u>public</u> utility to
ensure payment for such service, and such arrangements must be
consistent with the requirements of the utility's tariff.

184 (8) Each <u>electric</u> public utility customer who requires
185 medically essential service is solely responsible for any backup
186 equipment or power supply and a planned course of action in the
187 event of a power outage or interruption of service.

188 (9) Each <u>electric</u> <u>public</u> utility that provides electric
 189 service to any customer <u>whose electric service is certified as</u>
 190 <u>medically essential pursuant to this section</u> who requires
 191 medically essential service shall call, contact, or otherwise
 192 advise such customer of scheduled service interruptions.

(10) (a) Each <u>electric</u> <u>public</u> utility shall provide information on sources of state or local agency funding which may provide financial assistance to the <u>public</u> utility's customers who require medically essential service and who notify the <u>public</u> utility of their need for financial assistance.

(b)1. Each <u>electric</u> <u>public</u> utility that operates a program to receive voluntary financial contributions from the <u>public</u> utility's customers to provide assistance to persons who are

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201 unable to pay for the public utility's services shall maintain a 202 list of all agencies to which the public utility distributes 203 such funds for such purposes and shall make the list available 204 to any such person who requests the list.

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2. Each public utility that operates such a program shall: 206 Maintain a system of accounting for the specific a. 207 amounts distributed to each such agency, and the public utility and such agencies shall maintain a system of accounting for the 208 209 specific amounts distributed to persons under such respective 210 programs.
