Remove lines 524-611 and insert:

Section 13. Subsections (1) and (2) of section 101.64, Florida Statutes, are amended, and subsection (5) is added to that section, to read:

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101.64 Delivery of vote-by-mail ballots; envelopes; form.-(1) The supervisor shall enclose with each vote-by-mail ballot two envelopes: a secrecy envelope, into which the absent elector shall enclose his or her marked ballot; and a mailing envelope, into which the absent elector shall then place the secrecy envelope, which shall be addressed to the supervisor and also bear on the back side a certificate in substantially the

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17 following form: Note: Please Read Instructions Carefully Before 18 19 Marking Ballot and Completing Voter's Certificate. VOTER'S CERTIFICATE 20 21 I, ..., do solemnly swear or affirm that I am a qualified 22 and registered voter of .... 74 2. Mark your ballot in secret as instructed on the ballot.
75 You must mark your own ballot unless you are unable to do so
76 because of blindness, disability, or inability to read or write.

3. Mark only the number of candidates or issue choices for a race as indicated on the ballot. If you are allowed to "Vote for One" candidate and you vote for more than one candidate, your vote in that race will not be counted.

81 4. Place your marked ballot in the enclosed secrecy82 envelope.

5. Insert the secrecy envelope into the enclosed mailingenvelope which is addressed to the supervisor.

85 6. Seal the mailing envelope and completely fill out the86 Voter's Certificate on the back of the mailing envelope.

87 7. VERY IMPORTANT. In order for your vote-by-mail ballot
88 to be counted, you must sign your name <u>or print the last four</u>
89 <u>digits of your social security number</u> on the line above (Voter's
