A bill to be entitled

An act relating to risk protection orders; amending s. 790.401, F.S.; redefining the term "petitioner" to include individuals who have a biological or legal parent-child relationship with, who are a legal guardian of, or who are a sibling of a respondent; conforming provisions to changes made by the act; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subsection (1) and paragraphs (a), (b), (c), and (g) of subsection (2) of section 790.401, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

790.401 Risk protection orders.—

- (1) DEFINITIONS.—As used in this section, the term:
- (a) "Petitioner" means a law enforcement officer, or a law enforcement agency, an individual who has a biological or legal parent-child relationship with the respondent, including a stepparent-stepchild relationship and a grandparent-grandchild relationship, an individual who is the legal guardian of a respondent, or a sibling of a respondent who that petitions a court for a risk protection order under this section.
- (2) PETITION FOR A RISK PROTECTION ORDER.—There is created an action known as a petition for a risk protection order.
- (a) A petition for a risk protection order may be filed by a <u>petitioner</u> law enforcement officer or law enforcement agency.
- (b) An action under this section must be filed in the county where:

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1. The petitioner's law enforcement office is located, if the petitioner is a law enforcement officer or a law enforcement agency;

- 2. The residence of the petitioner is located, if the petitioner is not a law enforcement officer or a law enforcement agency; or
 - 3. the county where The respondent resides.
- (c) Such petition for a risk protection order does not require the petitioner or the respondent either party to be represented by an attorney.
- (g) The petitioner must list the address of record on the petition must be as being where the appropriate law enforcement agency is located, if the petitioner is a law enforcement officer or a law enforcement agency, or the residence of the petitioner, if the petitioner is not a law enforcement officer or a law enforcement agency.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2019.
