23	Section 1. Paragraphs (a) through (d) of subsection (1) of
24	section 413.08, Florida Statutes, are redesignated as paragraphs

(1) As used in this section and s. 413.081, the term:

34 <u>(a) "Emotional support animal" means an animal that does</u> 35 <u>not require training to do specific work or perform special</u> 36 <u>tasks for an individual with a disability but, by virtue of its</u> 37 <u>presence, provides support to alleviate one or more identified</u> 38 <u>symptoms or effects of an individual's disability.</u>

39 (e) (d) "Service animal" means an animal that is trained to do work or perform tasks for an individual with a disability, 40 including a physical, sensory, psychiatric, intellectual, or 41 42 other mental disability. The work done or tasks performed must 43 be directly related to the individual's disability and may 44 include, but are not limited to, guiding an individual who is 45 visually impaired or blind, alerting an individual who is deaf 46 or hard of hearing, pulling a wheelchair, assisting with mobility or balance, alerting and protecting an individual who 47 is having a seizure, retrieving objects, alerting an individual 48 to the presence of allergens, providing physical support and 49 50 assistance with balance and stability to an individual with a

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mobility disability, helping an individual with a psychiatric or 51 52 neurological disability by preventing or interrupting impulsive 53 or destructive behaviors, reminding an individual with mental 54 illness to take prescribed medications, calming an individual 55 with posttraumatic stress disorder during an anxiety attack, or 56 doing other specific work or performing other special tasks. A 57 service animal is not a pet. For purposes of subsections (2), 58 (3), and (4), the term "service animal" is limited to a dog or 59 miniature horse. The crime-deterrent effect of an animal's 60 presence and the provision of emotional support, well-being, 61 comfort, or companionship do not constitute work or tasks for 62 purposes of this definition.

(6) An individual with a disability is entitled to rent, lease, or purchase, as other members of the general public, any housing accommodations offered for rent, lease, or other compensation in this state, subject to the conditions and limitations established by law and applicable alike to all persons.

(b)<u>1.</u> An individual with a disability who has a service animal or who obtains a service animal is entitled to full and equal access to all housing accommodations provided for in this section, and such <u>individual</u> a person may not be required to pay extra compensation for such animal. <u>This subparagraph does not</u> apply to an emotional support animal.

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75	2.a. An individual with a disability who has an emotional
76	support animal or who obtains an emotional support animal is
77	entitled to full and equal access to all housing accommodations
78	provided for in this section, unless the specific animal poses a
79	direct threat to the safety or health of others or poses a
