5 Remove lines 76-123 and insert:

6 (b) The task force shall consist of 12 members. Membership  
7 shall be as follows:

8 1. Three agency heads or executive directors of cabinet  
9 agencies, or their designees, appointed by the Governor.

10 2. Four members of the public or private sector with  
11 knowledge and experience in blockchain technology, appointed by  
12 the Governor.

13 3. Three members of the public or private sector with  
14 knowledge and experience in blockchain technology, appointed by  
15 the Chief Financial Officer.

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16           4. One member from the private sector with knowledge and  
17 experience in blockchain technology, appointed by the President  
18 of the Senate.

19           5. One member from the private sector with knowledge and  
20 experience in blockchain technology, appointed by the Speaker of  
21 the House of Representatives.

22           (c) Within 90 days after the effective date of this act, a  
23 majority of the members of the task force must be appointed and  
24 the task force shall hold its first meeting. The task force  
25 shall elect one of its members to serve as chair. Members of the  
26 task force shall serve for the duration of the existence of the  
27 task force. Any vacancy that occurs shall be filled in the same  
28 manner as the original appointment. Task force members shall  
29 serve without compensation and are not entitled to reimbursement  
30 for per diem or travel expenses.
