6	WHEREAS, the Department of Law Enforcement reports that in
7	2017 violent crime posed a serious danger to Floridians, with
8	1,057 homicides, 7,934 rapes, 57,984 aggravated assaults, and
9	18,583 robberies committed in Florida, and
10	WHEREAS, the Federal Bureau of Investigation states that in
11	2017 approximately 1,247,321 violent crimes occurred throughout
12	the United States, including 17,284 homicides, 135,755 rapes,
13	810,825 aggravated assaults, and 319,356 robberies, and
14	WHEREAS, more than 2,600 of the people killed in violent
15	crimes each year are children age 19 or younger, such as the
16	homicide on August 30, 2016, in which 8-year-old Jada Page was
17	killed in a drive-by shooting in Miami, and
18	WHEREAS, the public has been horrified and saddened by the
19	mass shooting events such as the one on June 12, 2016, in which
20	49 people were killed and 53 people were wounded in the Pulse
21	nightclub in Orlando and the one on February 14, 2018, in which
22	17 people were killed and 14 people were wounded at Marjory
23	Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, and

24 WHEREAS, in the most recent statistics, Florida has the 25 21st highest violent crime rate and the 25th highest homicide 26 rate in the United States, and 27 WHEREAS, several Florida counties, including Miami-Dade, 28 Palm Beach, and Marion, have created violence prevention 29 projects to raise awareness and prevent violence in their 30 communities, and 31 WHEREAS, it is imperative that there be greater public 32 awareness and prevention of violence, NOW, THEREFORE, 33 34 Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of 35 Florida: 36 37 That the month of September 2019 is designated as "Violence 38 Prevention and Awareness Month" in Florida.
