House Resolution

A resolution recognizing April 24, 2019, as "Venezuelan Heritage Day" in Florida.

WHEREAS, Venezuela has a deep, rich heritage and is the home of ancient indigenous peoples like the Arawak and Carib Amerindians, and later became home to Spanish explorers who arrived to the area and founded the settlements of Valencia in 1555 and Santiago de León de Caracas in 1567, and

WHEREAS, Venezuela's vibrant and varied geography features towering mountains, broad river plains, arid coastal plains, tropical jungles, and the world's highest, uninterrupted waterfall, el Salto Ángel, and

WHEREAS, settlers soon understood the potential of Venezuela's soil-rich land, with agriculture becoming its chief economic activity by the late sixteenth century, and

WHEREAS, the many influential individuals of Venezuela include Simón Bolívar, the Venezuelan military and political leader who was instrumental in helping Latin American countries achieve independence from the Spanish Empire; Carlos Cruz-Diez, the renowned kinetic artist; Barbara Palacios, a business-owner and Miss Universe of 1986; Carolina Herrera, a Venezuelan-American fashion designer who dressed First Ladies from Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis to Michelle Obama; and Juan Guaidó, President of the National Assembly of Venezuela and is

recognized as acting President of Venezuela, and

WHEREAS, United Nations' research shows that, since 2014, an estimated 3 million Venezuelan people, which is approximately 10 percent of the country's population, have fled Venezuela, and a 2018 study by the University of Miami found that more than 200,000 Venezuelans have made Florida their home, and

WHEREAS, the number of Venezuelan students in Miami-Dade County public schools has soared in recent years, almost doubling to 9,873 from August 2015 to August 2017, and, as of the latter date, Ronald W. Reagan/Doral Senior High School had 950 Venezuelan students out of a total student body of approximately 2,500, and

WHEREAS, in Miami-Dade County and in Broward County, which is home to the Venezuelan enclave of Weston, Venezuelans are the largest foreign group of owners of residential real estate, and

WHEREAS, the Miami Association of Realtors reports that, in 2016, Venezuelans accounted for 17 percent of the total \$6.2 billion in South Florida residential real estate purchases by foreign buyers, and, in the booming Doral community in Miami-Dade County, 28 percent of the 59,000 residents, which is more than one in four, are Venezuelan, and

WHEREAS, Central Florida is now home to 140,000 Venezuelan residents, approximately 38,000 of whom are United States citizens, a number that has grown over the last year as the South American nation has spiraled into political and economic

51 upheaval, and 52 WHEREAS, according to the Pew Research Center, Venezuelans 53 account for 10,221 asylum applications filed between October 2015 and June 2016, which is up from 3,810 filed during the same 54 55 period the year before, NOW, THEREFORE, 56 57 Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida: 58 59 60 That April 24, 2019, is recognized as "Venezuelan Heritage 61

Day" in Florida.
