The Office of Economic and Demographic Research, in consultation with local school districts, shall 111 112 update the report issued in January 2017 entitled "Review of 113 Florida's Cost Per Student Station." The updated report must 114 include recommendations for modification by the Legislature of 115 the cost per student station model or implementation of a cost-116 per-square-foot model for new school construction. The report 117 must also include at least the following: a transparent and 118 replicable categorization of costs that must be included or 119 excluded from the model, the use of an index or process that 120 reflects changes in construction costs, and the development of a system that may be used by school districts to forecast costs of 121 122 new construction over time. The office shall provide the updated report to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the 123 124 Speaker of the House of Representatives no later than October 1, 125 2019.
