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327.39 Personal watercraft regulated.-26 27 (1) (a) A person may not operate a personal watercraft 28 unless each person riding on or being towed behind such vessel 29 is: 30 Wearing a personal flotation device, other than an 1. inflatable device, currently approved by the United States Coast 31 32 Guard and used in accordance with the United States Coast Guard 33 approval label. 34 2. Wearing a wet suit bottom or clothing other than normal 35 swimwear that provides equivalent protection against forceful 36 water entry into the lower body openings. Normal swimwear is not considered adequate protection against forceful water entry. 37 3. If under the age of 18, wearing a helmet that is 38 39 properly fitted and is fastened securely upon the head by a 40 strap and that meets state or federal safety standards for such 41 helmet. A helmet purchased before July 2, 2022, that meets the 42 standards of the American National Standards Institute or the 43 Snell Memorial Foundation, or any other nationally or 44 internationally recognized standards for personal watercraft 45 helmets, in compliance with rules established by the commission 46 may continue to be worn until January 1, 2026. On and after January 1, 2026, a person under the age of 18 must wear a helmet 47 48 that is approved by the United States Department of 49 Transportation, the Economic Commission for Europe, or the Snell 50 Memorial Foundation, in compliance with rules established by the

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51 commission. 52 (b) A person may not operate a personal watercraft towing 53 another person on water skis or other towables unless: 54 The total number of persons operating, observing, and 1. being towed does not exceed the specified number of passengers 55 56 as identified by the manufacturer as the maximum safe load for 57 the personal watercraft. 58 2. The personal watercraft has on board, in addition to 59 the operator, a rear-facing observer who monitors the progress 60 of the person being towed. A person operating a personal watercraft equipped by 61 (2) 62 the manufacturer with a lanyard type engine cutoff switch must attach such lanyard to his or her person, clothing, or personal 63 64 flotation device as is appropriate for the specific vessel. A person may not operate a personal watercraft at any 65 (3) 66 time between the hours from one-half hour after sunset to onehalf hour before sunrise. However, an agent or employee of a 67 68 fire or emergency rescue service is exempt from this subsection 69 while performing his or her official duties. 70 A personal watercraft must at all times be operated in (4) a reasonable and prudent manner. Maneuvers which unreasonably or 71 72 unnecessarily endanger life, limb, or property, including, but not limited to, weaving through congested vessel traffic, 73 74 jumping the wake of another vessel unreasonably or unnecessarily 75 close to such other vessel or when visibility around such other

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76 vessel is obstructed, and swerving at the last possible moment 77 to avoid collision shall constitute reckless operation of a 78 vessel, as provided in s. 327.33(1). <u>A Any person operating a</u> 79 personal watercraft must comply with the provisions of s. 80 327.33.

81 (5) <u>A</u> No person under the age of <u>16 may not</u> 14 shall
82 operate any personal watercraft on the waters of this state.

(6) (a) It is unlawful for The owner of any personal watercraft or <u>a</u> any person having charge over or control of a personal watercraft <u>may not</u> to authorize or knowingly permit the <u>personal watercraft</u> same to be operated by a person under <u>16</u> 14 years of age <u>in violation of this section</u>.

(b)1. It is unlawful for The owner of any leased, hired, or rented personal watercraft, or <u>a</u> any person having charge over or control of a leased, hired, or rented personal watercraft, <u>may not</u> to authorize or knowingly permit the watercraft to be operated by <u>a</u> any person who has not received instruction in the safe handling of personal watercraft, in compliance with rules established by the commission.

95 2. <u>A Any person receiving instruction in the safe handling</u> 96 of personal watercraft pursuant to a program established by rule 97 of the commission must provide the owner of, or person having 98 charge of or control over, a leased, hired, or rented personal 99 watercraft with a written statement attesting to the same.
