Section 13. Paragraph (a) of subsection (2) of section 624.316, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

624.316 Examination of insurers.

(2)(a) Except as provided in paragraph (f), the office may examine each insurer, including affiliates, as often as may be warranted for the protection of the policyholders and in the public interest, and shall examine each domestic insurer not



less frequently than once every 5 years. The examination shall cover the preceding 5 fiscal years of the insurer and shall be commenced within 12 months after the end of the most recent fiscal year being covered by the examination. The examination may cover any period of the insurer's operations since the last previous examination. The examination may include examination of events subsequent to the end of the most recent fiscal year and the events of any prior period that affect the present financial condition of the insurer.

Section 14. Section 626.7452, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

626.7452 Managing general agents; examination authority.-The acts of the managing general agent are considered to be the acts of the insurer on whose behalf it is acting. A managing general agent may be examined as if it were the insurer except in the case where the managing general agent solely represents a single domestic insurer.
