Paragraph (a) of subsection (3) of section 16 1003.4282, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 17 1003.4282 Requirements for a standard high school 18 diploma.-19 STANDARD HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA; COURSE AND ASSESSMENT (3) 20 REOUIREMENTS .-21 Four credits in English Language Arts (ELA).-The four (a) credits must be in ELA I, II, III, and IV. A student must pass 22 the statewide, standardized grade 10 Reading assessment or, when 23 implemented, the grade 10 ELA assessment, or earn a concordant 24 25 score, in order to earn a standard high school diploma. However,

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26	beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, an English Language
27	Learner who enrolled in a public school within the state in
28	grade 9 or later is exempt from the assessment requirements of

Gains in mathematics as measured by statewide, standardized
assessments administered under s. 1008.22(3).

9. The percentage of eligible students in the lowest 25 92 percent in English Language Arts, as identified by prior year 93 performance on statewide, standardized assessments, who make 94 Learning Gains as measured by statewide, standardized English 95 Language Arts assessments administered under s. 1008.22(3).

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h. The percentage of eligible students in the lowest 25
percent in mathematics, as identified by prior year performance
on statewide, standardized assessments, who make Learning Gains
as measured by statewide, standardized Mathematics assessments
administered under s. 1008.22(3).

i. For schools comprised of middle grades 6 through 8 or
grades 7 and 8, the percentage of eligible students passing high
school level statewide, standardized end-of-course assessments
or attaining national industry certifications identified in the
CAPE Industry Certification Funding List pursuant to rules
adopted by the State Board of Education.

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In calculating Learning Gains for the components listed in sub-88 89 subparagraphs e.-h., the State Board of Education shall require 90 that learning growth toward achievement levels 3, 4, and 5 is demonstrated by students who scored below each of those levels 91 92 in the prior year. In calculating the components in sub-93 subparagraphs a.-d., the state board shall include the 94 performance of English language learners only if they have been 95 enrolled in a school in the United States for more than 2 years. 96 2. For a school comprised of grades 9, 10, 11, and 12, or grades 10, 11, and 12, the school's grade shall also be based on 97 98 the following components, each worth 100 points:

99 a. The 4-year high school graduation rate of the school as100 defined by state board rule.

102	college and career credit through College Board Advanced
103	Placement examinations, International Baccalaureate
104	examinations, dual enrollment courses, or Advanced International
