## 456.51 Informed consent.-

- (1) A health care practitioner may not perform an examination of or provide medical care or treatment to a patient, with or without anesthesia, unless:
- (a) The health care practitioner first obtains written informed consent from the patient or the patient's legal representative for all medically necessary examinations or medical care or treatment to be performed on or provided to the patient, with or without anesthesia;
- (b) A court orders the performance of an examination of or the provision of medical care or treatment to the patient, with or without anesthesia; or
- (c) The performance of an examination or the provision of medical care or treatment is medically necessary to diagnose or treat the patient in a medical emergency.
- (2) A patient's attending health care practitioner may not allow a medical or nursing student, a resident physician, an intern, or a fellow in fellowship training to observe or participate in the provision of medical care or treatment to his or her patient while the patient is under anesthesia for any purpose, unless:
- (a) A court orders the performance of an examination of or the provision of medical care or treatment to the patient, with or without anesthesia;
- (b) The performance of an examination or the provision of medical care or treatment is medically necessary to diagnose or treat the patient in a medical emergency; or
  - (c) The attending health care practitioner obtains a

separate written informed consent form from the patient or the patient's legal representative in accordance with subsection (3) authorizing medical or nursing students, resident physicians, interns, or fellows in fellowship training to:

- 1. Be present only for the purpose of observing the provision of medical care or treatment by the attending health care practitioner to the patient while the patient is under anesthesia; or
- 2. For the purpose of conducting research or clinical training, participate, under the direct supervision of the attending health care practitioner or the supervising medical educator, in the provision of medical care or treatment by the attending health care practitioner to the patient while the patient is under anesthesia.
- (3) The separate written informed consent form required under paragraph (2)(c) must include all of the following:
- (a) The name and title of the patient's attending health care practitioner who is responsible for the medical care and treatment of the patient while the patient is under anesthesia, as indicated by the patient's medical care and treatment plan.
- (b) The name and title of any supervising medical educator who will be present or will be providing direct supervision to any medical or nursing student, resident physician, intern, or fellow in fellowship training during the provision of medical care or treatment to the patient while the patient is under anesthesia.
- (c) A statement that any observation or participation by a medical or nursing student, a resident physician, an intern, or a fellow in fellowship training in the provision of medical care

or treatment to the patient while the patient is under anesthesia will be:

- 1. Directly related to the patient's diagnosis and medical care and treatment plan established by the patient's attending health care practitioner;
- 2. Part of medical research being conducted by the medical or nursing student, resident physician, intern, or fellow in fellowship training; or
- 3. Part of the clinical training being provided to the medical or nursing student, resident physician, intern, or fellow in fellowship training.
- (d) A series of check boxes that allow the patient or the patient's legal representative to indicate whether he or she consents or withholds consent to:
- 1. The presence of medical or nursing students, resident physicians, interns, or fellows in fellowship training to observe the provision of medical care and treatment to the patient while the patient is under anesthesia only for the purpose of conducting medical research or receiving clinical training; or
- 2. The participation of medical or nursing students, resident physicians, interns, or fellows in fellowship training in the provision of medical care and treatment to the patient while the patient is under anesthesia for the purpose of conducting medical research or receiving clinical training.
- (e) A signature line designated for the patient or the patient's legal representative.
- (f) A signature line designated for the patient's attending health care practitioner and the supervising medical educator,

if different from the patient's attending health care practitioner.

- (4) A patient may amend or revoke his or her consent, verbally or in writing, at any time before the procedure begins or before the anesthesia is administered, whichever occurs earlier.
- (5) If a patient consents to have medical or nursing students, resident physicians, interns, or fellows in fellowship training observe or participate in the provision of medical care or treatment to the patient while under anesthesia, the patient's attending health care practitioner must do all of the following:
- (a) Inform the patient of his or her right to amend or revoke his or her consent at any time before the procedure begins or before anesthesia is administered, whichever occurs earlier.
- (b) Document in the patient's medical record the name of each medical or nursing student, resident physician, intern, or fellow in fellowship training who observed or participated in the provision of medical care or treatment to the patient while the patient was under anesthesia.
- (6) A patient's attending health care practitioner and a supervising medical educator, if different from the attending health care practitioner, who fails to comply with this section is subject to discipline by the applicable board, or the department if there is no board.
