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12	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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14	Section 1. Paragraph (d) of subsection (3) of section
15	937.022, Florida Statutes, as created by SB, 2020 Regular
16	Session, is amended to read:

19	(3) The clearinghouse shall:
20	(d) <u>1.</u> Establish and maintain the Camo Alert Voluntary
21	Registry, a voluntary registration system to manage the
22	voluntary registration of at-risk veterans by a veteran or his
23	or her legal guardian. Only those veterans who have voluntarily
24	requested to be included in the Camo Alert system shall be
25	included in the Camo Alert Voluntary Registry. The system shall
26	also provide for the removal and expungement of an at-risk
27	veteran's registration and information from the registry upon
28	written request from the veteran or his or her legal guardian
29	within 30 days after the clearinghouse receives the written

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30	request.
31	2. The name, address, telephone number, and other personal
32	identifying information of a person who is or has been included
33	in the Camo Alert Voluntary Registry is confidential and exempt
34	from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State
35	Constitution. This exemption is not waived by the release of
36	information about a listed person when a Camo Alert is issued.
37	This subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset
38	Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed
39	on October 2, 2025, unless reviewed and saved from repeal by the
40	Legislature.
41	Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public
42	necessity that the names, addresses, telephone numbers, and
43	other personal identifying information of persons who are or
44	have been included in the Camo Alert Voluntary Registry be made
45	confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and
46	s. 24(a), Article I of the State Constitution. Such information
47	is a private matter. Public knowledge of such information could
48	lead to discrimination against at-risk veterans, could
49	discourage at-risk veterans from seeking the benefits of being
50	included in the registry, and could compromise the therapeutic
51	process. An at-risk veteran may not want his or her status as an
52	at-risk person available to the public, and a lack of
53	confidentiality could discourage him or her from registering.
54	Also, an at-risk veteran may be involved in treatment, and
55	therapeutic and treatment programs cannot operate efficiently
56	and effectively if at-risk veterans are reluctant to participate
57	because their identities as at-risk persons would be subject to
58	inspection and review. The Legislature finds that the harm that
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59	may result from the release of the names, addresses, telephone
60	numbers, and other personal identifying information of such
61	persons outweighs any public benefit that may be derived from
62	the disclosure of the information.
63	Section 3. This act shall take effect on the same date that
64	SB or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation
65	is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension
66	thereof and becomes a law.

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
