 2 An act relating to the sexual battery prosecution time
 3 limitation; providing a short title; amending s.
 4 775.15, F.S.; creating an exception to the general
 5 time limitations which allows a prosecution to be
 6 commenced at any time for specified sexual battery
 7 offenses against victims younger than a certain age at
 8 the time the offense was committed; providing
 9 applicability; providing an effective date.

 11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

 13 Section 1. This act may be cited as "Donna's Law."

14 Section 2. Subsection (20) is added to section 775.15,
 15 Florida Statutes, and subsection (2) of that section is
 16 republished, to read:

17 775.15 Time limitations; general time limitations;
 18 exceptions.—

19 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this section,
 20 prosecutions for other offenses are subject to the following
 21 periods of limitation:

22 (a) A prosecution for a felony of the first degree must be
 23 commenced within 4 years after it is committed.

24 (b) A prosecution for any other felony must be commenced
 25 within 3 years after it is committed.

26 (c) A prosecution for a misdemeanor of the first degree
27 must be commenced within 2 years after it is committed.

28 (d) A prosecution for a misdemeanor of the second degree
29 or a noncriminal violation must be commenced within 1 year after
30 it is committed.

31 (20) If a victim is younger than 18 years of age at the
32 time the offense was committed, a prosecution for a violation of
33 s. 794.011 may be commenced at any time. This subsection applies
34 to an offense that is committed on or after July 1, 2020.

35 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2020.
