50	tenants a routine method for receiving and processing reasonable
51	accommodation requests for emotional support animals; however, a
52	housing provider may not require the use of a specific form or
53	notarized statements or deny a request solely because a tenant

55	(c) An emotional support animal registration of any kind,
56	including, but not limited to, an identification card, patch,

63	is liable for any damage done to the premises or to another
64	person on the premises by his or her emotional support animal.
