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1 Representative Latvala offered the following:

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3 **Amendment (with title amendment)**

4 Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert:

5 Section 1. This act may be cited as "Alyssa's Law."

6 Section 2. Paragraph (c) of subsection (4) of section  
7 1006.07, Florida Statutes, is redesignated as paragraph (d), and  
8 a new paragraph (c) is added to that subsection, to read:

9 1006.07 District school board duties relating to student  
10 discipline and school safety.—The district school board shall  
11 provide for the proper accounting for all students, for the  
12 attendance and control of students at school, and for proper

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13 attention to health, safety, and other matters relating to the  
14 welfare of students, including:

15 (4) EMERGENCY DRILLS; EMERGENCY PROCEDURES.—

16 (c) Beginning with the 2021-2022 school year, each public  
17 elementary, middle, and high school campus, including charter  
18 schools, must be equipped with a panic alert system for use in a  
19 life-threatening emergency, including active assailant  
20 situations, that can be activated anywhere on campus. Upon  
21 activation, the panic alert system, which shall be referred to  
22 as "Alyssa's Alert," must immediately transmit a signal or  
23 message to a public safety answering point, as defined in s.  
24 365.172(3). The panic alert system shall allow communication  
25 between the individual initiating the alert and the public  
26 safety answering point.

27 Section 3. For the 2020-2021 fiscal year, the sum of \$8  
28 million in nonrecurring funds is appropriated from the General  
29 Revenue Fund to the Department of Education to implement the  
30 panic alert system, referred to as "Alyssa's Alert," required in  
31 s. 1006.07(4)(c), Florida Statutes. The department shall issue a  
32 competitive solicitation to contract for a panic alert system  
33 that may be used by each school district. The panic alert system  
34 procured under this section must be certified by the United  
35 States Department of Homeland Security under the Support Anti-  
36 Terrorism by Fostering Effective Technologies Act of 2002.

37 Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2020.
