13	Section 1. This act may be cited as "Alyssa's Law."
14	Section 2. Paragraph (c) of subsection (4) of section
15	1006.07, Florida Statutes, is redesignated as paragraph (d), and
16	a new paragraph (c) is added to that subsection, to read:

24	(c) Beginning with the 2021-2022 school year, each public
25	elementary, middle, and high school campus, including charter
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26 schools, must be equipped with a panic alert system for use in a 27 life-threatening emergency, including active assailant 28 situations, that can be activated anywhere on campus. Upon 29 activation, the panic alert system, which shall be referred to 30 as "Alyssa's Alert," must immediately transmit a signal or 31 message to a public safety answering point, as defined in s. 32 365.172(3). The panic alert system shall allow communication 33 between the individual initiating the alert and the public 34 safety answering point. 35 Section 3. For the 2020-2021 fiscal year, the sum of \$8 million in nonrecurring funds is appropriated from the General 36 37 Revenue Fund to the Department of Education to implement the panic alert system, referred to as "Alyssa's Alert," required in 38 39 s. 1006.07(4)(c), Florida Statutes. The department shall issue a 40 competitive solicitation to contract for a panic alert system 41 that may be used by each school district. The panic alert system 42 procured under this section must be certified by the United 43 States Department of Homeland Security under the Support Anti-44 Terrorism by Fostering Effective Technologies Act of 2002. 45 Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2020.

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
