The 31 Department of Health, in consultation with the department, shall 32 develop instructional materials regarding the full range of 33 contraceptive methods available to prevent teenage pregnancy, 34 including the efficacy of each method, which must be in easily 35 comprehensible language and include only medically accurate, evidence-based information.
