33	Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public
34	necessity that the site-specific location information held by an
35	agency concerning a species listed by a federal agency as
36	endangered or threatened or listed by the Fish and Wildlife
37	Conservation Commission as threatened be made exempt from s.
38	119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and s. 24(a), Article I of the
39	State Constitution. The Legislature finds that the release of
40	such location information would jeopardize the continued
41	existence of endangered or threatened species by increasing the
42	risk of exposure to wildlife poachers or by threatening the
43	integrity of the site due to increased use or traffic. This
44	exemption protects private property owners from potential
45	trespass and related liability issues when endangered or
46	threatened species are found on their properties and encourages
47	such property owners, as well as researchers, to provide
48	agencies with information they might not otherwise provide if
49	such location information were made public. The Legislature
50	finds that the harm that may result from the release of such
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51	location	information	outweighs	any	public	benefit	that	may	be
