Section 330.401, Florida Statutes, is created 20 to read: 21 330.401 Phase-out of diesel exhaust fluid; reports and 22 certification; prohibition.-23 (1) The presence, storage, or use of diesel exhaust fluid, 24 including the use of such fluid to treat the exhaust of a 25 selective catalytic reduction engine, on the premises of a

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26	public airport as defined in s. 330.27 must be phased out by						
27	October 1, 2030, as provided in this section.						
28	(2)(a) The manager of each public airport at which:						
29	1. Aviation fuels receive onsite treatment with fuel						
30	system icing inhibitors by means of injection or mixing systems;

32	2. Any aircraft fuel delivery vehicle or ground service						
33	equipment the exhaust system of which is being treated with						
34	diesel exhaust fluid is operated within 150 feet of any aircraft

38	(b) The plan must include, at a minimum:						
39	1. A full inventory of all diesel exhaust fluid on the

50	(3) The diesel exhaust fluid safety mitigation and						

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51 exclusion plan must be approved by the regulatory authority 52 having jurisdiction over the airport by September 1, 2020. The 53 manager must, by October 1, 2020, submit the plan to the 54 Department of Environmental Protection and certify that all such 55 fluid and vehicles have been secured within the premises of the 56 airport. 57 (4) (a) The diesel exhaust fluid safety mitigation and 58 exclusion plan must be fully implemented on the premises of the 59 airport by January 1, 2021. 60 (b) Each year thereafter, the manager shall review the plan and shall submit the plan, including applicable amendments, 61 62 to the Department of Environmental Protection for certification. 63 If the department determines that the use of diesel exhaust 64 fluid is being phased out as described in subsection (1), the 65 department shall certify the plan for that year. 66 (c) Once all diesel exhaust fluid and all vehicles the 67 exhaust system of which were being treated with such fluid have 68 been removed from the premises of the airport, the manager must 69 submit a written report to the department certifying such 70 removal. If the department determines that such removal has been 71 accomplished, the annual certification provided in paragraph (b) is no longer required. 72 73 (5) The presence, storage, or use of diesel exhaust fluid 74 on the premises of a public airport as described in subsection 75 (1) is prohibited after October 1, 2030.
