5 Section 2. Subsections (2) through (8) of section 465.189, 6 Florida Statutes, are renumbered as sections (3) through (9), 7 respectively, subsection (1) and present subsection (6) are 8 amended, and a new subsection (2) is added to that section, to 9 read:

10 465.189 Administration of vaccines and epinephrine 11 autoinjection.-

12 (1) In accordance with guidelines of the Centers for 13 Disease Control and Prevention for each recommended immunization 590065

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or vaccine, a pharmacist, or a registered intern under the 14 supervision of a pharmacist who is certified under subsection 15 16 (7) (6), may administer the following vaccines to an adult 17 within the framework of an established protocol under a 18 supervising physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459: 19 Immunizations or vaccines listed in the Adult (a) Immunization Schedule as of February 1, 2015, by the United 20 21 States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Recommended Prevention. The board may authorize, by rule, additional 22 23 immunizations or vaccines as they are added to the Adult Immunization Schedule, the United States Centers for Disease 24 25 Control and Prevention's Health Information for International 26 Travel, or the United States Food and Drug Administration's 27 Vaccines Licensed for Use in the United States. 28 (b) Immunizations or vaccines recommended by the United 29 States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for international travel as of July 1, 2015. The board may 30 authorize, by rule, additional immunizations or vaccines as they 31 are recommended by the United States Centers for Disease Control 32 and Prevention for international travel. 33 34 (b) (c) Immunizations or vaccines approved by the board in response to a state of emergency declared by the Governor 35 36 pursuant to s. 252.36. 37

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38 A registered intern who administers an immunization or vaccine 39 under this subsection must be supervised by a certified 40 pharmacist at a ratio of one pharmacist to one registered 41 intern.

42 (2) A pharmacist who is certified under subsection (7) may
 43 administer influenza vaccines to individuals 7 years of age and
 44 older within the framework of an established protocol under a
 45 supervising physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459.

46 (7) (6) Any pharmacist or registered intern seeking to administer vaccines to adults under this section must be 47 certified to administer such vaccines pursuant to a 48 49 certification program approved by the Board of Pharmacy in consultation with the Board of Medicine and the Board of 50 51 Osteopathic Medicine. The certification program shall, at a 52 minimum, require that the pharmacist attend at least 20 hours of 53 continuing education classes approved by the board and the 54 registered intern complete at least 20 hours of coursework 55 approved by the board. The program shall have a curriculum of 56 instruction concerning the safe and effective administration of 57 such vaccines, including, but not limited to, potential allergic 58 reactions to such vaccines.
