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1	A bill to be entitled
2	An act for the relief of Christeia Jones, as the
3	natural parent and legal guardian of Logan Grant,
4	Denard Maybin, Jr., and Lanard Maybin; providing an
5	appropriation to compensate them for injuries and
6	damages sustained as a result of the alleged
7	negligence of Trooper Raul Umana and the Florida
8	Highway Patrol, a division of the Department of
9	Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles; providing that
10	certain payments and the appropriation satisfy all
11	present and future claims related to the alleged acts;
12	providing a limitation on the payment of specified
13	costs and fees; providing an effective date.
14	
15	WHEREAS, shortly before 9:25 p.m. on May 18, 2014, Florida
16	Highway Patrol Trooper Raul Umana attempted to cross through a
17	gap in the median onto the southbound lanes of I-75, south of
18	Ocala, and
19	WHEREAS, Trooper Umana misjudged the turn and his vehicle
20	struck the concrete barrier before shooting out into the
21	southbound lane and striking a car driven by Christeia Jones,
22	and
23	WHEREAS, Christeia Jones was transporting her minor sons,
24	2-year-old Logan Grant, who was secured in a forward-facing
25	infant seat, 7-year-old Denard Maybin, Jr., and 5-year-old
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26 Lanard Maybin, in the backseat of the car, and 27 WHEREAS, after being struck by Trooper Umana's vehicle, 28 Christeia Jones's car was struck in the rear by a tractor 29 trailer, and 30 WHEREAS, the impact crushed the trunk and rear seating area 31 of the car, and 32 WHEREAS, the car was propelled off the road, where it 33 struck a tree and caught fire, and WHEREAS, all three children were transported by helicopter 34 35 to the University of Florida Health Shands Hospital in 36 Gainesville, and 37 WHEREAS, at the hospital, Logan Grant was diagnosed with a severe traumatic brain injury, extensive facial fractures, 38 39 pulmonary edema, and respiratory failure, and WHEREAS, Logan Grant remained in the hospital for a month 40 before he was discharged to Brooks Rehabilitation Hospital in 41 42 Jacksonville for 2 weeks of brain injury rehabilitation, and 43 WHEREAS, Logan Grant continues to receive speech therapy 44 weekly and struggles with expressive and receptive language, and 45 WHEREAS, Logan Grant also exhibits left-side body weakness 46 and behavioral difficulties, and WHEREAS, Logan Grant's past medical bills exceed \$310,000, 47 and Medicaid has asserted a lien of \$135,161.64, and 48 WHEREAS, pediatric physical medicine and rehabilitation 49 50 specialist Dr. Paul Kornberg has examined Logan Grant and has Page 2 of 7

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51 observed ongoing left hemiparesis with motor, perceptual, 52 communicative, cognitive, and behavioral impairments of a 53 permanent nature which will prevent him from achieving gainful 54 employment, and

55 WHEREAS, Dr. Kornberg reported that Logan Grant is at a 56 high risk for developing seizures in the future, requires 57 ongoing bracing of his left ankle to improve gait, is 58 anticipated to require a scooter for long-distance mobility by 59 the age of 30, is likely to require invasive treatment or orthopedic surgery in the form of left heel-cord lengthening in 60 the future, and is expected to be unable to live alone as an 61 62 adult, necessitating guardianship and attendant care, and

63 WHEREAS, Dr. Michael Shahnasarian has estimated Logan 64 Grant's future medical and palliative care needs to be 65 \$6,702,555, and his loss of earning capacity over his lifetime 66 to be between \$1,543,014 and \$2,810,754, and

67 WHEREAS, Lanard Maybin arrived at Shands Hospital with a
68 Glasgow Coma Scale of 7, a head injury, a facial laceration, and
69 a shoulder injury that required surgery, and

70 WHEREAS, a plastic surgeon repaired Lanard Maybin's facial 71 laceration during his stay in the pediatric intensive care unit 72 before he was discharged from the hospital on May 22, 2014, and

73 WHEREAS, since the accident, Lanard Maybin has experienced 74 night terrors, changes in behavior and temperament, and has 75 gained significant weight, and

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76 WHEREAS, in early 2019, Dr. Patrick Gorman evaluated Lanard 77 Maybin and diagnosed him as having posttraumatic stress disorder 78 and significant neurocognitive difficulties secondary to 79 traumatic brain injury, and

80 WHEREAS, Lanard Maybin's past medical bills amount to 81 \$35,584.16, and Medicaid has asserted a lien in the amount of 82 \$22,525.66, and

83 WHEREAS, at Shands Hospital, Denard Maybin, Jr., was 84 intubated, was put on mechanical ventilation for a day, and was 85 diagnosed with a severe traumatic brain injury and a 86 subcutaneous soft tissue scalp laceration that required surgery, 87 and

88 WHEREAS, Denard Maybin, Jr., remained hospitalized for 2 89 weeks before he was transferred to Brooks Rehabilitation Center 90 in Jacksonville for acute inpatient rehabilitation, and

91 WHEREAS, the rehabilitation center noted that Denard 92 Maybin, Jr., had significant cognitive deficits as well as 93 impulsivity and behavioral changes, and

94 WHEREAS, Denard Maybin, Jr., continues to receive 95 occupational therapy, physical therapy, and speech therapy, and 96 WHEREAS, Denard Maybin, Jr.,'s past medical bills exceed 97 \$175,000, and Medicaid has asserted a lien of \$96,833.99, and

98 WHEREAS, specialist Dr. Paul Kornberg has diagnosed Denard 99 Maybin, Jr., with permanent impairment that will prevent him 100 from achieving gainful employment, and

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101	WHEREAS, Dr. Kornberg reported that Denard Maybin, Jr., is
102	at a high risk for developing seizures in the future and that he
103	is expected to be unable to live alone as an adult,
104	necessitating guardianship and attendant care, and
105	WHEREAS, Dr. Michael Shahnasarian has estimated Denard
106	Maybin, Jr.,'s future medical and palliative care needs to be
107	\$5,773,129, and his loss of earning capacity over his lifetime
108	to be between \$1,568,817 and \$2,858,577, and
109	WHEREAS, Christeia Jones, as parent and natural guardian of
110	Logan Grant, Denard Maybin, Jr., and Lanard Maybin, through a
111	lawsuit filed in Orange County under case number 2017-CA-00732-
112	O, alleged that the negligence of the Florida Highway Patrol,
113	through its trooper, was the proximate cause of serious injuries
114	to her minor sons, and
115	WHEREAS, Christeia Jones, through a separate lawsuit filed
116	in Orange County under case number 2018-CA-004258-0, alleged
117	that the negligence of the Florida Highway Patrol, through its
118	trooper, was the proximate cause of her injuries, and
119	WHEREAS, on November 30, 2018, in case number 2017-CA-
120	00732-0, Christeia Jones and the Florida Highway Patrol entered
121	into a settlement agreement regarding the claims of Ms. Jones
122	and her minor sons which arose out of the accident described in
123	this act, including the claims under case number 2018-CA-004258-
124	O, which are to be dismissed with prejudice, and
125	WHEREAS, Christeia Jones and the Florida Highway Patrol
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	WHEREAS, Christeia Jones and the Florida Highway Patrol

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126	acknowledged that if the case had gone to trial, a jury could
127	reasonably have awarded damages to Ms. Jones in the amount of
128	\$18 million, and
129	WHEREAS, the settlement agreement requires the Division of
130	Risk Management of the Department of Financial Services to pay
131	\$285,000 to Christeia Jones in accordance with the statutory
132	limits of liability set forth in s. 768.28, Florida Statutes,
133	and
134	WHEREAS, Christeia Jones seeks satisfaction of the
135	remaining balance of the settlement agreement, which is \$17.715
136	million, NOW, THEREFORE,
137	
138	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
139	
140	Section 1. The facts stated in the preamble to this act
141	are found and declared to be true.
142	Section 2. The sum of \$9 million is appropriated from the
143	General Revenue Fund to the Department of Highway Safety and
144	Motor Vehicles for the relief of Christeia Jones, as natural
145	parent and legal guardian of Logan Grant, Denard Maybin, Jr.,
146	and Lanard Maybin, to compensate Logan Grant, Denard Maybin,
147	Jr., and Lanard Maybin for injuries and damages sustained as a
148	result of the accident that occurred on May 18, 2014, due to the
149	negligence of an employee of the Department of Highway Safety
150	and Motor Vehicles.

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151	Section 3. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to draw
152	a warrant in favor of the special needs trusts for the exclusive
153	use and benefit of Logan Grant, Denard Maybin, Jr., and Lanard
154	Maybin, in the sum of \$9 million, upon funds of the Department
155	of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles in the State Treasury and
156	to pay the same out of such funds in the State Treasury.
157	Section 4. The amount paid by the Division of Risk
158	Management of the Department of Financial Services in accordance
159	with the statutory limits of liability set forth in s. 768.28,
160	Florida Statutes, and the amount awarded under this act are
161	intended to provide the sole compensation for all present and
162	future claims arising out of the factual situation described in
163	this act which resulted in damages sustained by Logan Grant,
164	Denard Maybin, Jr., and Lanard Maybin. Of the amount awarded
165	under this act, the total amount paid for attorney fees may not
166	exceed \$1,800,000, the total amount paid for lobbying fees may
167	not exceed \$450,000, and the total amount paid for costs or
168	other similar expenses may not exceed \$15,603.17.
169	Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 2020.

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
