 6           providing the purpose of the program; providing  
 7           definitions; requiring the Florida HIPPY Training &  
 8           Technical Assistance Center at the University of South  
 9           Florida, subject to legislative appropriation, to  
 10          provide grants to organizations establishing a HIPPY  
 11          program and organizations with an existing HIPPY  
 12          program; providing Florida HIPPY Training & Technical  
 13          Assistance Center at the University of South Florida  
 14          duties; providing program and reporting requirements;  
 15          providing an effective date.

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 17 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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 19           Section 1.   Section 1002.996, Florida Statutes, is created  
 20 to read:

21           1002.996   The Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool  
 22 Youngsters Grant Program.—

23           (1)   PURPOSE.—Subject to legislative appropriation, the  
 24 Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Youngsters (HIPPY)  
 25 Grant Program is established to fund HIPPY programs throughout

26 | the state to support the development and operation of such  
27 | programs which help empower parents to be their child's first  
28 | and most important teacher by equipping them with the tools,  
29 | skills, and confidence needed to educate their children at home.

30 | (2) DEFINITIONS.—

31 | (a) "Center" means the Florida HIPPY Training & Technical  
32 | Assistance Center at the University of South Florida.

33 | (b) "HIPPY program" means an evidence-based home  
34 | visitation program that supports parents in their critical role  
35 | as their child's first and most important teacher which is  
36 | created by the national nonprofit organization HIPPY USA and  
37 | administered to communities at a local level.

38 | (c) "Program operator" means an organization that has an  
39 | existing HIPPY program or is establishing a HIPPY program.

40 | (3) GRANT PROGRAM.—

41 | (a) Subject to legislative appropriation, the center shall  
42 | provide grants to program operators to fund HIPPY programs in  
43 | Florida counties, including, but not limited to, Alachua,  
44 | Bradford, Brevard, Broward, Duval, Gadsden, Gulf, Hillsborough,  
45 | Manatee, Marion, Miami-Dade, Palm Beach, Pasco, Pinellas, and  
46 | Sarasota Counties.

47 | (b) The center shall:

48 | 1. Create and administer an application process for  
49 | program operators to apply for a grant pursuant to this section.

50 | 2. Prioritize awards based on a program operator's

51 demonstration of the technical and financial ability to sustain  
52 a HIPPY program beyond an initial grant award.

53 (c) To receive a grant pursuant to this section:

54 1. If a program operator is establishing a HIPPY program,  
55 the operator must successfully complete the HIPPY USA  
56 application process and meet the requirements of HIPPY USA and  
57 the center; or

58 2. If a program operator has an existing HIPPY program,  
59 the operator must provide evidence that such program meets the  
60 requirements of HIPPY USA and the center.

61 (4) REPORTING.—Beginning September 1, 2021, and annually  
62 thereafter, the center shall publish on its website information  
63 about each program operator receiving a grant from the center to  
64 establish or operate a HIPPY program. The information must  
65 include:

66 (a) The amount of grant funds provided by the center and  
67 the amount of additional funds the program operator receives  
68 from other sources.

69 (b) A description of the services and family engagement  
70 activities provided through the HIPPY program.

71 (c) The number of children and families served through the  
72 HIPPY program.

73 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2020.
