78	(c) A family or assisted-use restroom facility that has a
79	universal changing place shall include signage at or near the
80	entrance to the family or assisted-use restroom facility
81	indicating that the facility has a universal changing place. If
82	a place of public accommodation or public building or facility
83	has a central directory identifying the location of offices,
84	restrooms, and other facilities, the central directory shall
85	indicate the location of each universal changing place in the
86	place of public accommodation or public building or facility.
87	(4) This section applies to any place of public
88	accommodation or public building or facility that is open to the
89	public and is:
90	(a) Built on or after January 1, 2021; or
91	(b) An existing place of public accommodation or public
