Between lines 238 and 239 of the amendment, insert:

6 (j)1. May use eligible contributions received pursuant to 7 this section and ss. 212.099, 212.1832, and 1002.40 during the 8 state fiscal year in which such contributions are collected for 9 administrative expenses if the organization has operated as an 10 eligible nonprofit scholarship-funding organization for at least the preceding 3 fiscal years and did not have any findings of 11 material weakness or material noncompliance in its most recent 12 audit under paragraph (m). Administrative expenses from eligible 13 528871

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contributions may not exceed 3 percent of the total amount of 14 all scholarships awarded by an eligible scholarship-funding 15 16 organization under this chapter. Such administrative expenses 17 must be reasonable and necessary for the organization's 18 management and distribution of scholarships awarded under this 19 chapter. No funds authorized under this subparagraph shall be 20 used for lobbying or political activity or expenses related to 21 lobbying or political activity. Up to one-third of the funds 22 authorized for administrative expenses under this subparagraph may be used for expenses related to the recruitment of 23 contributions from taxpayers. An eligible nonprofit scholarship-24 25 funding organization may not charge an application fee.

Must expend for annual or partial-year scholarships an 26 2. 27 amount equal to or greater than 75 percent of the net eligible contributions remaining after administrative expenses during the 28 29 state fiscal year in which such contributions are collected. No 30 more than 25 percent of such net eligible contributions may be carried forward to the following state fiscal year. All amounts 31 32 carried forward, for audit purposes, must be specifically 33 identified for particular students, by student name and the name of the school to which the student is admitted, subject to the 34 requirements of ss. 1002.22 and 1002.221 and 20 U.S.C. s. 1232g, 35 and the applicable rules and regulations issued pursuant 36 thereto. Any amounts carried forward shall be expended for 37 38 annual or partial-year scholarships in the following state 528871

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39 fiscal year. No later than September 30 of each year, net eligible contributions remaining on June 30 of each year that 40 41 are in excess of the 25 percent that may be carried forward 42 shall be used to provide scholarships to eligible students or 43 transferred to other eligible nonprofit scholarship-funding 44 organizations to provide scholarships for eligible students. All 45 transferred funds must be deposited by each eligible nonprofit scholarship-funding organization receiving such funds into its 46 scholarship account. All transferred amounts received by any 47 48 eligible nonprofit scholarship-funding organization must be separately disclosed in the annual financial audit required 49 50 under paragraph (m).

3. Must, before granting a scholarship for an academic
year, document each scholarship student's eligibility for that
academic year. A scholarship-funding organization may not grant
multiyear scholarships in one approval process.
