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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to administration of vaccines; amending s. 465.189, F.S.; revising the recommended immunizations or vaccines a pharmacist, or a registered intern under certain conditions, may administer; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. Subsection (1) of section 465.189, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
- 465.189 Administration of vaccines and epinephrine autoinjection.—
- (1) In accordance with guidelines of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for each recommended immunization or vaccine, a pharmacist, or a registered intern under the supervision of a pharmacist who is certified under subsection (6), may administer the following vaccines to an adult within the framework of an established protocol under a supervising physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459:
- (a) Immunizations or vaccines listed in the Adult

  Immunization Schedule as of February 1, 2015, by the United

  States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Recommended

  Prevention. The board may authorize, by rule, additional

  immunizations or vaccines as they are added to the Adult

Control and Prevention's Health Information for International
Travel, or the United States Food and Drug Administration's
Vaccines Licensed for Use in the United States.

- (b) Immunizations or vaccines recommended by the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for international travel as of July 1, 2015. The board may authorize, by rule, additional immunizations or vaccines as they are recommended by the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for international travel.
- (b) (c) Immunizations or vaccines approved by the board in response to a state of emergency declared by the Governor pursuant to s. 252.36.

A registered intern who administers an immunization or vaccine under this subsection must be supervised by a certified pharmacist at a ratio of one pharmacist to one registered intern.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2020.
