25	the rod or cable shall be anchored in a manner that prevents the

26 removal of the firearm from the premises; 27 (b) Store the firearm in a locked fireproof safe or vault 28 in the licensee's business premises; or (c) Store the firearm in a hardened, impact-resistant, 29 30 locked cabinet. (2) A duly authorized agent or employee of the Department 31 of Agriculture and Consumer Services may inspect in a lawful 32 manner at all reasonable hours any business premises subject to 33 the requirements of this section. 34 35 (3) A violation of this section is a noncriminal 36 violation, punishable as provided in s. 775.083. 37 Section 2.
