CS/HB 967 2020

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A bill to be entitled An act relating to clerks of the court; amending s. 40.29, F.S.; requiring the Justice Administrative Commission to provide funds to the clerks of court for specified jury-related costs; requiring the clerks of court to submit a request for reimbursement for juryrelated costs to the Clerks of Court Operations Corporation within specified timeframes; requiring the Clerks of Court Operations Corporation to review the requests for reimbursement and submit a request to the Justice Administrative Commission; requiring the Justice Administrative Commission to review the amounts for specified purposes and submit a request for payment to the Chief Financial Officer; removing a provision authorizing the Justice Administrative Commission to apportion funds for certain purposes among the counties; providing that the clerks of the court are responsible for certain jury-related costs that exceed funding provided in the General Appropriations Act; providing an effective date. Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: Subsection (5) of section 40.29, Florida Section 1.

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40.29 Payment of due-process costs.-

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The Justice Administrative Commission shall provide funds to the clerks of the court to compensate jurors, to pay for meals or lodging provided to jurors, and to pay for juryrelated personnel and operational costs as provided in this section. Each clerk of the court shall submit a request for reimbursement forward to the Clerks of Court Operations Corporation within 20 days after each quarter attesting to the clerk's actual costs Justice Administrative Commission a quarterly estimate of funds necessary to compensate jurors, to and pay for meals or lodging provided to jurors, and to pay for jury-related personnel and operational costs during the upcoming quarter. The Florida Clerks of Court Operations Corporation shall review the request for reimbursement to ensure that the costs are reasonable and directly related to jury management. The Clerks of Court Operations Corporation shall forward to the Justice Administrative Commission a quarterly estimate of the amount necessary to reimburse each clerk of the court unless the total request for reimbursement by the clerks exceeds the quarterly funds available provided by the Justice Administrative Commission, in which case the Clerks of Court Operations Corporation shall adjust the cumulative total to match the available funds before submitting the request to the Justice Administrative Commission for its personnel and other costs related to jury management. Upon receipt of each request for

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reimbursement such estimates, the Justice Administrative Commission shall review determine the amount deemed necessary for payment to the clerks of the court for the most recently completed during the upcoming quarter, determine if the total payment amount is available, and submit a request for payment to the Chief Financial Officer. If the Justice Administrative Commission believes that the amount appropriated by the Legislature is insufficient to meet such costs during the remaining part of the state fiscal year, the commission may apportion the funds appropriated in the General Appropriations Act for those purposes among the several counties, basing the apportionment upon the amount expended for such purposes in each county during the prior fiscal year, in which case, the Chief Financial Officer shall issue the appropriate apportioned amount by warrant to each county. The clerks of the court are responsible for any compensation to jurors, for payments for meals or lodging provided to jurors, and for jury-related personnel and operational costs that exceed the funding provided in the General Appropriations Act for these purposes. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2020.

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
