## Amendment (with title amendment)

Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert:

<u>Section 1. Section 943.7, Florida Statutes, is created to read:</u>

- 943.7 -- Florida Commission on Combating Public Disorder.-
- (1) Legislative findings; intent.—The Legislature finds
  that the public disorder is a symptom of complex economic,
  social, and moral concerns. As such, combatting public disorder
  requires more than enforcement of our criminal code. It requires
  understanding and addressing the root causes of public disorder.
- (2) There is established in the Department of Law Enforcement the Florida Commission on Combating Public Disorder,

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consisting of 28 members. The Speaker of the House of
Representatives, the President of the Senate, the Attorney
General, and the Governor shall each appoint four members, and
the Chief Financial Officer and the Commissioner of Agriculture,
the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives, and the
Minority Leader of the Senate shall each appoint three members,
for a term of 4 years. The members appointed shall include
persons who represent rural and urban interests and the ethnic
and cultural diversity of the state's population. With respect
to the appointments by the Governor, at least one appointment
must be a certified law enforcement officer, at least one
appointee must be a person previously convicted of a felony in
the state, and one person must be a member of a group or
organization categorized as a 501(c)3 by the Internal Revenue
Service and whose purpose is to advance the interests of a
minority community. At least one appointee of each remaining
appointment authority must be a member of the public who is not
a public office holder, a candidate for public office, and has
not held public office before. No member shall serve more than 8
consecutive years on the commission. A vacancy shall be filled
for the remainder of the unexpired term in the same manner as
the original appointment.
     (3) The commission shall meet once in the first, second,
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chairperson or two other officers. Annually, at the meeting in

and fourth quarters of each year and upon the call of the

the first quarter, officers consisting of	f a chairperson, vice
chairperson, secretary, and treasurer sha	all be elected. Each
officer shall serve until a successor is	elected and qualified.
No officer shall serve more than two cons	secutive terms in the
same office.	

- (4) Members of the commission shall serve without compensation.
- (5) It shall be the duty of the commission to study public disorder in Florida. The study shall include, but not be limited to, the following areas:
  - (a) The economic factors that influence Public Disorder.
  - (b) The social factors that influence Public Disorder.
- (c) The public perception of the legitimacy of government authority.
- (d) The effectiveness of current public programs designed promote education and economic mobility.
- (e) The effectiveness of the state's criminal justice system including diversion programs, alternatives to incarceration, custodial punishment, conditions of confinement, reentry, and fees and fines.
- (f) The role and perception of law enforcement in the community.
- (6) Beginning January 1, 2022, the commission shall report annually on January 1 to the Governor, the Attorney General, the Cabinet, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the

President of the Senate, and the minority leaders of the House and Senate on the study carried out under the provisions of this section. This study must include legislative proposals designed to address the root causes of Public Disorder.

Section 2. This act is effective upon becoming law.
