31 (1) A certified nursing assistant may administer oral, 32 transdermal, ophthalmic, otic, rectal, inhaled, enteral, or 33 topical prescription medication to a patient of a home health agency or nurse registry if the certified nursing assistant has 34 35 been delegated such task by a registered nurse licensed under part I of this chapter, has satisfactorily completed an initial 36 37 6-hour training course approved by the board, and has been found 38 competent to administer medication to a patient in a safe and 39 sanitary manner. The training, determination of competency, and initial and annual validation required under this section must 40 be conducted by a registered nurse licensed under this chapter 41 42 or a physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459.
