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16	Section 1. Subsection (4) of section 401.265, Florida
17	Statutes, is amended to read:

19	(4) Each medical director who uses a paramedic or <u>an</u>
20	emergency medical technician to perform blood pressure
21	screenings and screening, health promotion, and wellness
22	activities, or <u>a paramedic</u> to administer <u>immunizations or other</u>
23	public health countermeasures immunization on a any patient
24	under a protocol as specified in s. 401.272, which is not in the
25	provision of emergency care, is liable for any act or omission
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of <u>a</u> any paramedic or <u>an</u> emergency medical technician acting under his or her supervision and control when performing such services.

29 Section 2. Subsections (2), (3), and (4) of section 30 401.272, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

31 401.272 Emergency medical services community health care.32 (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
33 contrary:

(a) Paramedics or emergency medical technicians may
perform health promotion and wellness activities and blood
pressure screenings in a nonemergency environment, within the
scope of their training, and under the direction of a medical
director. As used in this paragraph, the term "health promotion
and wellness" means the provision of public health programs
pertaining to the prevention or reduction of illness and injury.

(b) Paramedics may administer immunizations or other 41 42 public health countermeasures in a nonemergency environment, 43 within the scope of their training, and under the direction of a 44 medical director. There must be a written agreement between the 45 paramedic's medical director and the department or the county 46 health department located in each county in which the paramedic administers immunizations or other public health 47 48 countermeasures. This agreement must establish the protocols, policies, and procedures under which the paramedic must operate. 49 50 (3) Each medical director under whose direction a

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51 paramedic administers immunizations or other public health 52 countermeasures must verify and document that the paramedic has 53 received sufficient training and experience to administer 54 immunizations or other public health countermeasures. The 55 verification must be documented on forms developed by the 56 department, and the completed forms must be maintained at the 57 service location of the licensee and made available to the 58 department upon request.

59 The department may adopt and enforce all rules (4) necessary to enforce the provisions relating to a paramedic's 60 administration of immunizations or other public health 61 countermeasures and the performance of health promotion and 62 63 wellness activities and blood pressure screenings by a paramedic 64 or emergency medical technician in a nonemergency environment. Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2021.

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
