An act relating to the retail sale of dogs or cats; creating s. 828.32, F.S.; defining terms; prohibiting pet stores from selling or offering for sale dogs or cats; providing noncriminal penalties; specifying that municipalities and counties are not restricted from enacting or enforcing more stringent ordinances; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 828.32, Florida Statutes, is created to read:
828.32 Retail sale of dogs or cats prohibited; penalty.-
(1) As used in this section, the term:
(a) "Pet store" means a for-profit place of business that sells or offers for sale animals to the public at retail. The term does not include a person who offers for sale, directly to the public, only animals that the person has bred and raised.
(b) "Sell or offer for sale" means to advertise or display for sale, barter, or trade.
(2) A pet store may not sell or offer for sale a dog or cat.
(3) A sale or offer for sale of a dog or cat made in violation of this section constitutes a noncriminal violation, punishable as provided in s. 775.083. Each sale or offer for sale made in violation of this section constitutes a separate offense.
(4) This section does not prohibit the enactment or

enforcement of a municipal or county ordinance restricting the sale or offer for sale of animals that is more stringent than this section.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2021.
