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## Amendment (with directory and title amendments)

Remove lines 83-102 and insert:

(3) (a) The Department of Health shall create an develop and implement a comprehensive information clearinghouse to educate health care providers, inform parents, and increase public awareness regarding prenatally diagnosed conditions which must include all of the following brain development, developmental disabilities and delays, and all services, resources, and interventions available to mitigate the effects of impaired development among children. The clearinghouse must use the term "unique abilities" as much as possible when

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identifying infants or children with developmental disabilities and delays. The clearinghouse must provide:

- 1.(a) A description of the condition, including its causes, effects on development, and potential complications

  Health information on conditions that may lead to impaired development of physical, learning, language, or behavioral skills.
- <u>2.(b)</u> <u>Diagnostic tests</u> <u>Education and information to</u> <u>support parents whose unborn children have been prenatally</u> <u>diagnosed with developmental disabilities or whose children have diagnosed or suspected developmental delays.</u>
- 3.(c) Options for treatment and therapy Education and training for health care providers to recognize and respond appropriately to developmental disabilities, delays, and conditions related to disabilities or delays. Specific information approved by the advisory council shall be made available to health care providers for use in counseling parents whose unborn children have been prenatally diagnosed with developmental disabilities or whose children have diagnosed or suspected developmental delays.
- <u>4.(d)</u> Contact information for local, state, and national organizations that provide educational and support services and programs Promotion of public awareness of availability of supportive services, such as resource centers, educational

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programs, other support programs for parents and families, and
developmental evaluation and intervention services.
(e) Hotlines specific to Down syndrome and other
prenatally diagnosed developmental disabilities. The hotlines

and the department's clearinghouse must provide information to

parents and families or other caregivers regarding the Early

Steps Program under s. 391.301, the Florida Diagnostic and

Learning Resources System, the Early Learning program, Healthy

Start, Help Me Grow, and any other intervention programs.

Information offered must include directions on how to obtain early intervention, rehabilitative, and habilitative services

- (b) With regards to the medical information provided through the clearinghouse, the department shall include only information that is current and based on medical evidence.
- (c) The department shall periodically review and update the information on the department's website.
