(b) The food outlet, food service establishment, or school is located not more than 15 miles from an authorized composting facility or anaerobic digestion facility with available capacity to accept such material.

- (2) Effective January 1, 2023, an educational facility as defined in s. 1013.01 shall ensure that the food waste materials that are generated at the educational facility are recycled at an authorized composting facility, an anaerobic digestion facility, or at another authorized recycling method if the following requirements are met:
- (a) The educational facility generates at least 52 tons of food waste materials per year.
- (b) The educational facility is located not more than 15 miles from an authorized composting facility or anaerobic digestion facility with available capacity to accept such material.
- (3) The department shall waive the requirements of this section if a food outlet, a food service establishment, a school, or an educational facility is able to show that the fee charged by the county under s. 403.706(1) for the handling and disposal of solid waste at the solid waste facility is less than the fee charged for food waste materials by each composting facility or anaerobic digestion facility located within 15 miles of the food outlet, food service establishment, school, or educational facility.
