A bill to be entitled

An act relating to applied behavior analysis services; amending s. 400.9905, F.S.; revising the definition of the term "clinic" to exempt certain groups of individuals providing applied behavior analysis services from health care clinic licensure requirements; amending s. 1003.572, F.S.; revising the definition of the term "private instructional personnel" to include certain registered behavior technicians; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Present paragraphs (o), (p), and (q) of subsection (4) of section 400.9905, Florida Statutes, are redesignated as paragraphs (p), (q), and (r), respectively, and a new paragraph (o) is added to that subsection, to read:

400.9905 Definitions.-

Notwithstanding this subsection, an entity shall be deemed a clinic and must be licensed under this part in order to receive reimbursement under the Florida Motor Vehicle No-Fault Law, ss. 627.730-627.7405, unless exempted under s. 627.736(5)(h).

Section 2. Present paragraphs (b) through (f) of subsection (1) of section 1003.572, Florida Statutes, are redesignated as paragraphs (c) through (g), respectively, and a new paragraph (b) is added to that subsection, to read:

1003.572 Collaboration of public and private instructional personnel.—

- (1) As used in this section, the term "private instructional personnel" means:
- (b) Registered behavior technicians who have a nationally recognized paraprofessional certification in behavior analysis and who practice under the supervision of an individual described in paragraph (a), assisting and supporting such individual in the provision of applied behavior analysis services.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2021.
