| 23 | discipline and school safetyThe district school board shall |
| 24 | provide for the proper accounting for all students, for the |
| 25 | attendance and control of students at school, and for proper |
| 26 | attention to health, safety, and other matters relating to the |
| 27 | welfare of students, including: |
| 28 | (10) STUDENT MENTAL HEALTHAdopt policies to provide |
| 29 | mental health assistance to students in grades 9 through 12. |
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| 30 | These policies must include all of the following: |
| 31 | (a) Access to mental health professionals in the school |
| 32 | setting. Such professionals must include therapists, counselors, |
| 33 | psychologists, and social workers. |
| 34 | (b) A continuum of services available during the school day |
| 35 | to facilitate better access to such services and improved |
| 36 | outcomes. |
| 37 | (c) Procedures to aid a student experiencing a mental |
| 38 | health crisis on a school campus. Such procedures must: |
| 39 | 1. Ensure that the student receives an appropriate level of |
