18	Section 1. Section 1002.935, Florida Statutes, is created						
19	to read:						
20	1002.935 Early Learning Scholarship Program.—						
21	(1) PURPOSE.—There is established the Early Learning						
22	Scholarship Program to be administered by the Office of Early						
23	Learning. The program is established in order to increase access						
24	to high-quality early childhood programs.						
25	(2) ELIGIBILITYA child from birth to the beginning of						
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26	the school year for which the child is eligible for admission to					
27	kindergarten in a public school under s. 1003.21(1)(a)2., is					
28	eligible for a scholarship under this program if the child is:					
29	(a) A resident of the state.					
30	(b) The sibling of a child who is medically complex and					
31	the medical condition is such that the child is technologically					
32	dependent upon medical equipment or procedures to sustain life					
33	and who can expire without warning, unless continually under					
34	observation.					
35	(c) Not enrolled in a school readiness program under s.					
36	1002.87 or a prekindergarten program under s. 1002.55, s.

44	(4) ADMINISTRATION					
45	(a) Subject to the appropriation of funds by the					
46	Legislature, the office shall annually coordinate with early					
47	learning coalitions to issue scholarships from the program.					
48	(b) The office shall establish application timelines and					
49	determine the schedule for disbursing scholarship awards by					
50	direct payment from early learning coalitions to providers.					

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51 The early learning coalitions shall prioritize the (C) 52 award of scholarships to children whose families are not 53 currently receiving, or on a waiting list for, a publicly funded 54 program providing part-time child care or early childhood 55 education services. 56 The office shall establish criteria for early learning (d) 57 coalitions to use to determine the amount of scholarship awards. 58 The total amount of a scholarship award, or the amount of a 59 scholarship award in combination with any other public funds received to provide part-time child care or early childhood 60 education, may not exceed the provider's published private pay 61 62 rate for the appropriate level of care. Scholarship funds may not be used to supplant any federal funding received by the 63 64 program to provide services for the child. 65 The office shall include a report on program (e) 66 implementation and progress in the report required under s. 67 1002.82(5). The report must include, at a minimum, information on the number and ages of children served and the total number 68 69 and amount of scholarships awarded, the efficiency and 70 effectiveness of program administration, and the impact on 71 kindergarten readiness. 72 (5) PROVIDER ELIGIBILITY.-73 (a) A provider is eligible to receive scholarship funds if 74 the provider is: 75 Authorized under s. 1002.55 and meets the minimum 1.
