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to the road, particularly with respect to grade, composition, stability, and separation from the edge of the road and any paved shoulder.

- 2. What constitutes a hazardous condition for walkways perpendicular to the road, particularly with respect to the presence of multiple lanes of traffic, and locations where it is likely that pedestrians crossing the roadway will encounter traffic turning from left turn lanes, lanes where a right turn on red is authorized, and free-flow right turn lanes.
- 3. Whether railroad crossings, bridges, and overpasses that lack paved walkways designed for pedestrians are suitable walkways.
- 4. Whether midblock crossings should be supplemented by special emphasis markings such as signals, signs, beacons, or enhanced overhead lighting that conspicuously identify the locations as pedestrian crossing sites.
- (b) Be developed with input from appropriate stakeholders, including, but not limited to, the Department of Education, school districts, counties, municipalities, metropolitan planning organizations, parents and students.
- (c) Recommend criteria for identifying hazardous walking conditions.
 - Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
