19	but need not be limited to, the health care provider's gloved
20	hand or instrumentation.
21	(2) A health care practitioner, a medical student, or any
22	other student receiving training as a health care practitioner
23	may not perform a pelvic examination on a patient without the
24	written consent of the patient or the patient's legal
25	representative executed specific to, and expressly identifying,

27	(a) A court orders performance of the pelvic examination

32	defined in s. 395.002(8);
33	(c) The pelvic examination is administered related to a
34	child protective investigation under chapter 39; or
