  - 3.2. "Homeless status" means that the victim:
- a. Lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence; or

b. Has a primary nighttime residence that is:

- (I) A supervised publicly or privately operated shelter designed to provide temporary living accommodations; or
- (II) A public or private place not designed for, or ordinarily used as, a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings.
- (2) A person or organization that establishes by clear and convincing evidence that it has been coerced, intimidated, or threatened in violation of this section has a civil cause of action for treble damages, an injunction, or any other appropriate relief in law or in equity. Upon prevailing in such civil action, the plaintiff may recover reasonable attorney fees and costs.
- (3) It is an essential element of this section that the record reflect that the defendant perceived, knew, or had reasonable grounds to know or perceive that the <u>person</u> victim was within the class delineated in this section.
- Section 2. Subsections (1) and (3) of section 775.0863, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
- 775.0863 Evidencing prejudice while committing offense against person with mental or physical disability; reclassification.—
- (1) (a) The penalty for any felony or misdemeanor shall be reclassified as provided in this subsection if the commission of such felony or misdemeanor evidences prejudice based in whole or

- (b) As used in paragraph (a), the term "disability" "mental or physical disability" means a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more of a person's major life activities a condition of mental or physical incapacitation due to a developmental disability, organic brain damage, or mental illness, and one or more mental or physical limitations that restrict a person's ability to perform the normal activities of daily living.
- (3) It is an essential element of this section that the record reflect that the defendant perceived, knew, or had reasonable grounds to know or perceive that the <u>person</u> victim was within the class delineated in this section.
  - Section 3. This act shall take effect October 1, 2021.
