If the date of an applicant's passing American Dental Licensing Examination <u>or passing WREB Dental Examination</u> scores from an examination previously administered in a jurisdiction other than this state under subparagraph 1. is older than 365 days, such scores are nevertheless valid for the purpose of licensure in this state, but only if the applicant demonstrates that all of the following additional standards have been met:

a. The applicant completed the American Dental Licensing
Examination or the WREB Dental Examination after October 1,

e.(I)(A) The applicant submits proof of having been

(II) As used in this section, "full-time practice" is defined as a minimum of 1,200 hours per year for each and every year in the consecutive 5-year period or, when applicable, the period since initial licensure, and must include any combination of the following:

(6) (a) It is the finding of the Legislature that absent a

226 threat to the health, safety, and welfare of the public, the 227 relocation of applicants to practice dentistry within the 228 geographic boundaries of this state, who are lawfully and 229 currently practicing dentistry in another state or territory of 230 the United States, the District of Columbia, or the Commonwealth 231 of Puerto Rico, based on their scores from the American Dental 232 Licensing Examination or the WREB Dental Examination 233 administered in a state other than this state, is substantially 234 related to achieving the important state interest of improving access to dental care for underserved citizens of this state and 235 236 furthering the economic development goals of the state. 237 Therefore, in order to maintain valid active licensure in this 238 state, all applicants for licensure who are relocating to this 239 state based on scores from the American Dental Licensing 240 Examination or the WREB Dental Examination administered in a state other than this state must actually engage in the full-241 242 time practice of dentistry inside the geographic boundaries of 243 this state within 1 year after <del>of</del> receiving such licensure in 244 this state. The Legislature finds that, if such applicants do 245 not actually engage in the full-time practice of dentistry 246 within the geographic boundaries of this state within 1 year after of receiving such a license in this state, access to 247 dental care for the public will not significantly increase, 248 patients' continuity of care will not be attained, and the 249 250 economic development goals of the state will not be

(5) Effective July 1, 2012, an applicant who has completed the ADEX Dental Hygiene Examination or the WREB Dental Hygiene Examination in a jurisdiction other than this state and who has obtained a passing score may practice dental hygiene in this state if the applicant:

(a) Has successfully completed the National Board DentalHygiene Examination at any time before the date of application;

(b) Has been certified by the American Dental Association

before the date of application, as specified by state law;

(c) Has successfully completed a written examination on the laws and rules of this state regulating the practice of dental hygiene;

(d) Has not been disciplined by a board, except forcitation offenses or minor violations; and

 regardless of adjudication, any felony or misdemeanor related to
 the practice of a health care profession.
