20	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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22	Section 1. Paragraph (d) of subsection (3) of section
23	1002.20, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
24	1002.20 K-12 student and parent rightsParents of public
25	school students must receive accurate and timely information
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regarding their child's academic progress and must be informed 26 of ways they can help their child to succeed in school. K-12 27 28 students and their parents are afforded numerous statutory 29 rights including, but not limited to, the following: 30 (3) HEALTH ISSUES.-31 Reproductive health and disease education.-A public (d) 32 school student whose parent makes written request to the school 33 principal shall be exempted from the teaching of reproductive health or any disease, including HIV/AIDS, in accordance with 34 35 the provisions of s. 1003.42(3). Each school district shall, on the district's website homepage, notify parents of this right 36 37 and the process to request an exemption. The homepage must 38 include a link for a student's parent to access and review the 39 instructional materials, as defined in s. 1006.29(2), used to 40 teach the curriculum. Section 2. Subsections (1) and (3) of section 1003.42, 41 42 Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 43 1003.42 Required instruction.-44 (1) (a) Each district school board shall provide all 45 courses required for middle grades promotion, high school 46 graduation, and appropriate instruction designed to ensure that students meet State Board of Education adopted standards in the 47 following subject areas: reading and other language arts, 48 mathematics, science, social studies, foreign languages, health 49 50 and physical education, and the arts. The state board must

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51 remove a middle grades course in the Course Code Directory that 52 does not fully integrate all appropriate curricular content 53 required by s. 1003.41 and may approve a new course only if it 54 meets the required curricular content.

(b) All instructional materials, as defined in s.
1006.29(2), used to teach reproductive health or any disease,
including HIV/AIDS, its symptoms, development, and treatment, as
part of the courses referenced in subsection (3), must be
annually approved by a district school board in an open, noticed
public meeting.

Any student whose parent makes written request to the 61 (3) 62 school principal shall be exempted from the teaching of reproductive health or any disease, including HIV/AIDS, its 63 64 symptoms, development, and treatment. A student so exempted may 65 not be penalized by reason of that exemption. Course descriptions for comprehensive health education shall not 66 67 interfere with the local determination of appropriate curriculum 68 which reflects local values and concerns. Each school district 69 shall, on the district's website homepage, notify parents of 70 this right and the process to request an exemption. The homepage 71 must include a link for a student's parent to access and review 72 the instructional materials, as defined in s. 1006.29(2), used 73 to teach the curriculum. 74 Section 3. Paragraph (b) of subsection (4) of section 75 1006.40, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
