(a) A person convicted of a violation of this subsection, where the finder of fact determines that the violation includes the knowing and intentional torture or torment of an animal that injures, mutilates, or kills the animal, shall be ordered to pay a minimum mandatory fine of \$2,500 and undergo psychological counseling or complete an anger management treatment program.

A person convicted of a second or subsequent violation 36 (b) 37 of this subsection shall be required to pay a minimum mandatory 38 fine of \$5,000 and serve a minimum mandatory period of 39 incarceration of 6 months. In addition, the person shall be released only upon expiration of sentence, is not eligible for 40 parole, control release, or any form of early release, and must 41 42 serve 100 percent of the court-imposed sentence. Any plea of 43 nolo contendere shall be considered a conviction for purposes of 44 this subsection.
