Section 1. Section 918.13, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

918.13 Tampering with or fabricating physical evidence.-

- (1) \underline{A} No person, knowing that a criminal trial or proceeding or an investigation by a duly constituted prosecuting authority, law enforcement agency, grand jury or legislative committee of this state is pending or is about to be instituted, $\underline{may not}$ shall:
- (a) Alter, destroy, conceal, or remove any record, document, or thing with the purpose to impair its verity or availability in such proceeding or investigation; or
- (b) Make, present, or use any record, document, or thing, knowing it to be false.
- (2) (a) Except as provided in paragraphs (b) and (c), a Any person who violates any provision of this section commits shall

- (b) Except as provided in paragraph (c), a person who violates any provision of this section relating to a criminal trial or proceeding or an investigation involving a violent felony offense described in s. 775.084(1)(b)1. commits a felony of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
- (c) A person who violates any provision of this section relating to a criminal trial or proceeding or an investigation involving a capital offense, or an offense involving the death of a person, commits a felony of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
