1 House Resolution 2 A resolution recognizing March 26, 2021, as "Refugee 3 Day at the Florida Capitol" and June 20, 2021, as "World Refugee Day" in Florida. 4 5 6 WHEREAS, there has been a long bipartisan tradition, 7 keeping with our nation's values and respect for human rights, 8 in welcoming refugees to the United States, and 9 WHEREAS, the economic and social strength of the United 10 States and the State of Florida derives in large part from the diversity of its citizenry and the strength of those individuals 11 12 who have left their countries to come to a new home, and 13 WHEREAS, refugees do not leave their home countries by 14 choice but rather have been forced to flee due to dangerous circumstances and often out of fear of persecution for reasons 15 of race, religion, nationality, political opinion, or membership 16 17 in a particular social group, and WHEREAS, Florida has helped resettle countless refugees 18 19 starting as early as 1960 with Operation Peter Pan, which brought more than 14,000 unaccompanied Cuban minors to the 20 21 state, and WHEREAS, Florida has helped resettle refugees from 22 23 Southeast Asia, including Laos, Cambodia, and Vietnam, and 24 WHEREAS, refugee status is granted to individuals who 25 demonstrate the greatest and most immediate need for protection

and, since the passage of the Refugee Act of 1980, the United States has admitted more than 3.1 million refugees, with Florida being fourth in the nation for resettling refugees between 2002 and 2017, and

30 WHEREAS, between 1972 and 1981, more than 55,000 Haitians 31 came to Florida, many of whom settled in the neighborhood of 32 Little Haiti, and today Florida is home to the largest number of 33 Haitians in the United States, and

34 WHEREAS, Miami-Dade County is one of the top locations in 35 the United States for people coming from Central America, 36 particularly Nicaraguans and Costa Ricans, and South America to 37 settle, and

38 WHEREAS, refugees contribute to our economy in various 39 ways, such as buying or selling homes, being small business 40 owners, paying taxes, innovating and sharing their creativity, 41 and becoming a part of the state's workforce, NOW, THEREFORE,
