and insert:

Section 1. Subsection (3) and paragraphs (b) and (c) of subsection (4) of of section 491.005, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

491.005 Licensure by examination.-

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(3) MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPY.-Upon verification of

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11	documentation and payment of a fee not to exceed \$200, as set by
12	board rule, plus the actual cost of the purchase of the

15	department shall issue a license as a marriage and family
16	therapist to an applicant who the board certifies <u>has met the</u>
17	following criteria:
18	(a) Has Submitted an application and paid the appropriate
19	fee.
20	(b) 1. Obtained one of the following:
21	a. A minimum of a master's degree in marriage and family
22	therapy from a program accredited by the Commission on
23	Accreditation from Marriage and Family Therapy Education.
24	b. A minimum of a master's degree with major emphasis in
25	marriage and family therapy or a closely related field from a
26	university program accredited by the Council for Accreditation
27	of Counseling and Related Educational Programs and graduate
28	courses approved by the board.
29	c. A minimum of a master's degree with an emphasis in
30	marriage and family therapy or a closely related field, with a
31	degree conferred date before July 1, 2026, from an
32	institutionally accredited college or university and graduate
33	course approved by the board.
34	Has a minimum of a master's degree with major emphasis in
35	marriage and family therapy or a closely related field from a
36	program accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for
37	Marriage and Family Therapy Education or from a Florida
38	university program accredited by the Council for Accreditation
39	of Counseling and Related Educational Programs and graduate



40 courses approved by the Board of Clinical Social Work, Marriage
41 and Family Therapy, and Mental Health Counseling.

2. If the course title that appears on the applicant's 42 43 transcript does not clearly identify the content of the coursework, the applicant shall provide additional 44 45 documentation, including, but not limited to, a syllabus or catalog description published for the course. The required 46 47 master's degree must have been received in an institution of higher education that, at the time the applicant graduated, was 48 49 fully accredited by an institutional a regional accrediting body 50 recognized by the Commission on Recognition of Postsecondary 51 Accreditation or publicly recognized as a member in good 52 standing with the Association of Universities and Colleges of 53 Canada, or an institution of higher education located outside 54 the United States and Canada which, at the time the applicant 55 was enrolled and at the time the applicant graduated, maintained 56 a standard of training substantially equivalent to the standards 57 of training of those institutions in the United States which are 58 accredited by an institutional a regional accrediting body 59 recognized by the Commission on Recognition of Postsecondary 60 Accreditation. Such foreign education and training must have 61 been received in an institution or program of higher education 62 officially recognized by the government of the country in which 63 it is located as an institution or program to train students to 64 practice as professional marriage and family therapists or 65 psychotherapists. The applicant has the burden of establishing 66 that the requirements of this provision have been met, and the board shall require documentation, such as an evaluation by a 67 foreign equivalency determination service, as evidence that the 68



69 applicant's graduate degree program and education were 70 equivalent to an accredited program in this country. An applicant with a master's degree from a program that did not 71 72 emphasize marriage and family therapy may complete the 73 coursework requirement in a training institution fully 74 accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Marriage and 75 Family Therapy Education recognized by the United States 76 Department of Education.

77 (c) Has Had at least 2 years of clinical experience during which 50 percent of the applicant's clients were receiving 78 79 marriage and family therapy services, which must have been be at 80 the post-master's level under the supervision of a licensed 81 marriage and family therapist with at least 5 years of 82 experience, or the equivalent, who is a qualified supervisor as determined by the board. An individual who intends to practice 83 84 in Florida to satisfy the clinical experience requirements must register pursuant to s. 491.0045 before commencing practice. If 85 a graduate has a master's degree with a major emphasis in 86 87 marriage and family therapy or a closely related field which did not include all of the coursework required by paragraph (b), 88 89 credit for the post-master's level clinical experience may not 90 commence until the applicant has completed a minimum of 10 of 91 the courses required by paragraph (b), as determined by the board, and at least 6 semester hours or 9 quarter hours of the 92 93 course credits must have been completed in the area of marriage 94 and family systems, theories, or techniques. Within the 2 years 95 of required experience, the applicant must shall provide direct 96 individual, group, or family therapy and counseling to cases including those involving unmarried dyads, married couples, 97

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98 separating and divorcing couples, and family groups that include 99 children. A doctoral internship may be applied toward the 100 clinical experience requirement. When a registered intern is 101 providing clinical services through telehealth, a licensed 102 mental health professional must be accessible by telephone or 103 other electronic means. A licensed mental health professional 104 must be on the premises when clinical services are provided by a 105 registered intern in a private practice setting.

(d) Has Passed a theory and practice examination <u>designated</u> by board rule provided by the department.

(e) Has Demonstrated, in a manner designated by board rule, knowledge of the laws and rules governing the practice of clinical social work, marriage and family therapy, and mental health counseling.

For the purposes of dual licensure, the department shall license as a marriage and family therapist any person who meets the requirements of s. 491.0057. Fees for dual licensure may not exceed those stated in this subsection.

(4) MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING.-Upon verification of documentation and payment of a fee not to exceed \$200, as set by board rule, plus the actual per applicant cost of purchase of the examination from the National Board for Certified Counselors or its successor organization, the department shall issue a license as a mental health counselor to an applicant who the board certifies:

(b) 1. Has a minimum of an earned master's degree from a
mental health counseling program accredited by the Council for
the Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs



127 which consists of at least 60 semester hours or 80 quarter hours 128 of clinical and didactic instruction, including a course in 129 human sexuality and a course in substance abuse. If the master's 130 degree is earned from a program related to the practice of 131 mental health counseling which is not accredited by the Council 132 for the Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational 133 Programs, then the coursework and practicum, internship, or 134 fieldwork must consist of at least 60 semester hours or 80 135 quarter hours and meet all of the following requirements:

136 a. Thirty-three semester hours or 44 quarter hours of 137 graduate coursework, which must include a minimum of 3 semester 138 hours or 4 quarter hours of graduate-level coursework in each of 139 the following 11 content areas: counseling theories and 140 practice; human growth and development; diagnosis and treatment 141 of psychopathology; human sexuality; group theories and 142 practice; individual evaluation and assessment; career and 143 lifestyle assessment; research and program evaluation; social 144 and cultural foundations; substance abuse; and legal, ethical, 145 and professional standards issues in the practice of mental 146 health counseling. Courses in research, thesis or dissertation 147 work, practicums, internships, or fieldwork may not be applied toward this requirement. 148

b. A minimum of 3 semester hours or 4 quarter hours of
graduate-level coursework addressing diagnostic processes,
including differential diagnosis and the use of the current
diagnostic tools, such as the current edition of the American
Psychiatric Association's Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of
Mental Disorders. The graduate program must have emphasized the
common core curricular experience.

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c. The equivalent, as determined by the board, of at least

157 700 hours of university-sponsored supervised clinical practicum, 158 internship, or field experience that includes at least 280 hours 159 of direct client services, as required in the accrediting 160 standards of the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and 161 Related Educational Programs for mental health counseling 162 programs. This experience may not be used to satisfy the post-163 master's clinical experience requirement. 164 2. Has provided additional documentation if a course title 165 that appears on the applicant's transcript does not clearly 166 identify the content of the coursework. The documentation must 167 include, but is not limited to, a syllabus or catalog 168 description published for the course. 169 170 Education and training in mental health counseling must have 171 been received in an institution of higher education that, at the 172 time the applicant graduated, was fully accredited by a regional 173 accrediting body recognized by the Council for Higher Education 174 Accreditation or its successor organization or publicly 175 recognized as a member in good standing with the Association of 176 Universities and Colleges of Canada, or an institution of higher 177 education located outside the United States and Canada which, at 178 the time the applicant was enrolled and at the time the applicant graduated, maintained a standard of training 179 180 substantially equivalent to the standards of training of those 181 institutions in the United States which are accredited by a 182 regional accrediting body recognized by the Council for Higher 183 Education Accreditation or its successor organization. Such foreign education and training must have been received in an 184

198	equivalent accrediting body, as determined by board rule, which
199	consists of at least 60 semester hours or 80 quarter hours to
