Work experience acquired as a part of the education requirement may 61 62 not be construed as experience in responsible charge.

The applicant has received a bachelor's degree, its 63 (b) 64 equivalent, or higher in a course of study, other than in 65 surveying and mapping, at an accredited college or university 66 and has a specific experience record of 2 6 or more years as a 67 subordinate to a registered surveyor and mapper in the active practice of surveying and mapping, which experience is 5 years 68 69 of which shall be of a nature indicating that the applicant was 70 in responsible charge of the accuracy and correctness of the 71 surveying and mapping work performed. The applicant must have 72 completed a minimum of 25 semester hours from a college or university approved by the board in surveying and mapping 73 74 subjects or in any combination of courses in civil engineering, 75 surveying, mapping, mathematics, photogrammetry, forestry, or

Any of the required 25 76 77 semester hours of study completed not as a part of the 78 bachelor's degree, its equivalent, or higher may be approved at 79 the discretion of the board. 82 (c) The applicant has received an associate degree and has 83 a specified experience record of 4 or more years as a subordinate to a professional surveyor and mapper in the active 84 practice of surveying and mapping, which experience is of a 85 86 nature indicating that the applicant was in responsible charge 87 of the accuracy and correctness of the surveying and mapping 88 work performed. Work experience acquired as a part of the 89 education requirement may not be construed as experience in responsible charge. 90

(f) The applicant has received a registered apprenticeship 107 108 certificate in surveying and mapping after completing a 109 registered apprenticeship program approved by the Department of 110 Education and has a specified experience record of 2 or more 111 years as a subordinate to a professional surveyor and mapper in 112 the active practice of surveying and mapping, which experience 113 is of a nature indicating that the applicant was in responsible 114 charge of the accuracy and correctness of the surveying and 115 mapping work performed.
